BJP's Venkata Ramana Reddy Vivekanand win by huge margins emerges giant killer in Kamareddy

The Congress won a decisive mandate in the country's youngest State of Telangana, wresting power from the Bharat Rashtra Samithi with its 'maarpu kaavali' (change is needed) slogan after counting was completed for the 119 constituencies in the State on


The Congress won 64 seats, while the BRS won 39. The State went to polls on November 30 and registered a polling percentage of 71.34. Counting began in 49 counting centres at 8 am on Sunday. As for the other parties, the AIMIM was declared victor in five and leading in two in its traditional strongholds in Hyderabad, with Akbaruddin Owaisi winning from Chandrayangutta by 81,660 votes. The CPI's lone candidate Kunamneni Sambasiva Rao, who contested in an alliance with the Congress, won comfortably from Kothagudem, while the CPI (M) drew a nil.

The BJP, which made significant gains in comparison with its single-seat victory in 2018, won eight seats this time. These included Kamareddy where its candidate K Venkata Ramana Reddy emerged a giant killer by defeating the two biggest names of this Assembly election — K Chandrashekhar Rao and A Revanth Reddy.

Chandrashekhar Rao and Revanth Reddy, however, secured comfortable victories in their regular constituencies of Gajwel and

Kodangal, respectively. While Chandrashekhar Rao trounced the BJP's Etala Rajendar by 45,031 votes in Gajwel, Revanth Reddy defeated BRS candidate Patnam Narender Reddy by 32.532 votes.

Even as the Congress continued to keep its winning candidates in a close huddle at a star hotel in the city, with Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar managing affairs, reports indicated that a swearing-in ceremony could be organised either on Monday itself or on December 9.

Meanwhile, BRS working president KT Rama Rao,

KCR tenders resignation to Guv

HYDERABAD: Accepting the verdict of the people in the Assembly polls, Chief Minister K Chandrashekhar Rao tendered his resignation on Sunday. His resignation letter was sent to Governor Tamilisai Soundararajan and accepted by her. "As part of the democratic process, our Chief Minister has sent his resignation to the Governor and the due process will follow," BRS working president KT Rama Rao said. The BRS secured 39 of the 119 seats it contested in the election, with the final results awaited in a few seats.

conceding his party's defeat, congratulated the Congress on the victory in Telangana and extended his best wishes to the party. Expressing his gratitude to the people of Telangana for giving the BRS two consecutive terms, he said he was "not saddened over the result", but "surely disappointed" as it was not on expected lines. Rama Rao, on the personal front, secured a comfortable victory by a margin of 29,687 votes in Sircilla.

The results on Sunday, which saw quite a few BRS candidates win by huge margins, including Finance Minister T Harish Rao and KP Vivekanand, also saw six Ministers losing — right from Errabelli Dayakar Rao, Allola Indrakaran Reddy, Singireddy Niranjan Reddy to V Srinivas Goud, Koppula Eshwar and Puvvada Ajay Kumar. The Congress had some stinging loses too.


BJP wins all 3 in Hindi heartland

NEW DELHI

The BJP swept Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh on Sunday inflicting a resounding defeat on the Congress to tighten its stranglehold in the Hindi heartland, in a big boost for Prime Minister Narendra Modi and setting the tone for the 2024 Lok Sabha elections. Counting of votes in Mizoram will be taken up on Monday. As the BJP leader-

ship savoured the triple victory just months after losing its lone southern citadel Karnataka, Modi said some people are already saying that the party's hat-trick in the States is a guarantee of hat-trick in the Lok Sabha polls. "We bow to the Janta Janardan. The results in Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan indicate that the people of India are firmly with politics of good governance and development, which the @BJP4India stands," Modi earlier said in a post on X, after a ringing endorsement of the BJP's strategy centred on the Prime Minister's ap-

peal and governance plank.
Ruling MP for 18 years, a well-entrenched BJP managed to stave off anti-incumbency in a shot in the arm for four-time Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chauhan and dashing the hopes of a resurgent Con-



gress helmed by veteran and former CM Kamal Nath. Winning 141 seats and leading in 24, the BJP got a simple majority and could get two-thirds majority in a House of 230. Congress bagged 45 and was leading 19. Suspense also mounted as to who will be the BJP's CM in any of the three Hindi heartland States. Party workers and leaders attributed the win to Modi's "guarantees". PTI

'Pragathi Bhavan to be called Ambedkar Praja Bhavan'

Addressing the media at Gandhi Bhavan here on Sunday, he said it was the responsibility of the Congress to fulfil the aspirations of the people of Telangana after forming the new government in the State. The government Congress would strive to restore democratic values and safeguard the rights of citizens.

"I thank the four crore people of Telangana for electing the Congress and

paying their tributes to Srikantha Chari on his death anniversary on December 3 through this verdict," Revanth Reddy said, assuring that besides the six guarantees, all promises made by Rahul Gandhi will be fulfilled. The TPCC president specifically thanked Rahul Gandhi for his support and said the Bharat Jodo Yatra,

which was conducted for 150 days covering 4,000 km, infused a lot of confidence in the Congress cadre. Time and again, both Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi had reiterated that the Gandhi family's relationship with the people of Telangana was not political but a family bond, he said.

Faulty roads causing accidents: Gadkari

aulty road engineering is often the reason for five lakh accidents reported in India every year, union Road Transport and Highways Minister Nitin Gadkari said here on Sunday, urging engineers to work towards removing black spots to save lives.

Gadkari, while addressing the 82nd annual session of the Indian Roads Congress, called for reducing construction costs without compromising on quality by using alternative materials and the latest technology and com-

Talking about the Uttarkashi tunnel collapse, in which 41 labourers were trapped and rescued after a marathon effort of 17 days, the Minister said one cannot forget those

who went inside the tunnel and risked their lives to save the lives of the men trapped inside. "India accounts for five

lakh accidents and 1.5 lakh deaths annually, and three lakh people are injured. This caused a 3 per cent loss to the country's GDP. Like a sacrificial lamb, a driver is blamed for every accident. Let me tell you, and I observe minutely often, the road engineering is at fault," he said. While constructing roads, one should ensure that they are engineered properly to prevent accidents,

he said. "I also suffered from an accident and was left with four broken bones. Many are dying. People in the age group of 18-34 account for 60 per cent of accident deaths, and many of them are engineers and doctors," he said. PTI

India doesn't sign COP pact

India on Sunday refrained from signing the COP28 Declaration on Climate and Health, with sources pointing out that curbing greenhouse gas use for cooling in the health sector, which is one of the points in the document, may not be practical or achievable within the country's healthcare infrastructure in the short term.
