No clarity yet on new CM

Kharge to take a call, says DK Shivakumar

Consensus eluded the Congress, as usual, with uncertainty continuing over who would be the next Congress Legislature Party leader and Chief Minister in Telangana.

The newly-elected 64 MLAs of the Congress, though sitting pretty over its first electoral victory in the State, spent the entire time on the first day after the results huddled in a hotel in Gachibowli, only to see trouble-shooter and Karnataka Deputy Chief Minis-ter DK Shivakumar airdashing to New Delhi without any decision being taken here. Shivakumar will reportedly convey the pref-erences of the 64 MLA elects to the Congress high command.

Interestingly, Shivakumar told the media earlier in the day that the CLP meeting had authorised the AICC president, Mallikarjun Kharge to select the CLP leader. TPCC president A Revanth Reddy, senior leaders Mallu Bhatti Vikra-marka, N Uttam Kumar Reddy, Komatireddy Venkat Reddy — all four of whom are the top contenders to the post - and others had unanimously authorised Kharge to appoint the CLP leader, Shivakumar said.

"The resolution authorising Kharge to decide on the CLP leader was moved by Revanth Reddy, seconded by Bhatti Vikramarka,

GOVERNOR DISSOLVES STATE ASSEMBLY

HYDERABAD: The Election Commission of India (ECI) has issued a gazette notification and shared the details of newly-elected MLAs to establish the third Legislative Assembly of Telangana. To this effect, Chief Electoral Officer Vikas Rai and ECI Principal Secretary Avinash Kumar met Governor Tamilisai Soundarajan at Raj Bhavan on Monday. They submitted the notification containing the details of the newly-elected MLAs. The Governor later dissolved the State's second Assembly. (SEE PAGE 2)

13 killed in Manipur gunfight

IMPHAL: At least 13 people, suspected to be the cadres of the outlawed PLA terror group, were killed after a gunfight in a remote border village of Manipur's Tengnoupal district on Monday. As soon as the information was shared with police, teams were dispatched to Leithu village, where they found bodies of at least 13 people, the officials said. Quoting some witnesses, the officials said that a gunfight had broken out on Monday noon after which the bodies had been found. Reports suggest that these could be cadres of the Valley-based insurgent group People's Liberation Army, whose ban under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act was extended recently. PTI

LS passes Bill aimed at regulating legal profession

NEW DELHI: A Bill which aims at regulating the legal profession by a single Act and seeks to target "touts" was passed by the Lok Sabha on Monday with Union Law Minister Ariun Ram Meghwal saying there should be no role of such persons in the country's courts. The Bill was already cleared by the Rajya Sabha in the Monsoon session. Replying to a debate on the Advocates (Amendment) Bill, 2023, Meghwal said this Bill was passed by the Rajya Sabha on August 3 and it was discussed in the Lok Sabha on Monday.

Mizoram: ZPM bags majority

AIZAWL: The Zoram People's Movement (ZPM) stormed to power in Mizoram by dethroning the Mizo National Front (MNF) bagging 27 seats in the 40-member House on Monday. The MNF won 10 seats, BJP (2) and Congress (1). Election Commission officials said. Prominent ZPM winners include the party's Chief Minister face Lalduhoma, who secured the Serchhip seat defeating his MNF rival J Malsawmzuala Vanchhawng by 2,982 votes. Chief Minister and MNF chief Zoramthanga lost to ZPM's Lalthansanga by 2,101 votes, the Election Commission said
