# WFI row: Bajrang returns Padma Shri

### Olympic medallist leaves award on pavement at Kartavya Path

NEW DELHI

There seems to be no end to controversies in Indian wrestling as Olympic medallist grappler Bajrang Punia on Friday returned his Padma Shri award to the government in protest against the election of Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh loyalist Sanjay Singh as the president of Wrestling Federation of India (WFI).

On Thursday, Sanjay Singh was elected as the president of the WFI after the panel led by the close aide of Brij Bhushan won 13 of the 15 posts. The wrestlers had demanded that no close associate of Brij Bhushan should enter the WFI.

Bajrang was conferred with the Padma Shri, the fourth highest civilian honour in the country, in 2019 after a consistent run on the mat that saw him win laurels at top international events. He posted a letter on X after making an attempt to meet Prime Minister Narendra Modi in Parliament but was stopped at Kartavya Path by

the Delhi Police. The Tokyo bronze winner placed the Padma Shri on the letter he had written to the Prime Minister, and put it on the pavement.

"I had received this honour from the government but I feel despite this honour I could not protect the honour of the daughters of this country, so I do not deserve

to keep this award," Bajrang said. "The administration is right in saying that I have not taken prior permission to meet the PM, so I could not meet him. I have kept the Padma Shri here on top of the letter because I can not put it on the floor," he said adding that he will not take it back home.

Asked what his message to the Prime Minister was, Bajrang said, "If the voice of women wrestlers has not yet reached you and if it reaches you in future please help them in getting justice." Later, Bajrang posted his let-ter on X with a message, "I am returning my Padma Shri award to the Prime Minister. This is just my letter. This is my statement."

The 29-year-old world championship medallist wrote: "Dear PM Ji, hope your health is well. You must be busy in many work but I am writing this to draw your attention to the wrestlers of the country. I too joined their protest. The protest stopped after the government promised strong action." (SEE PAGE 2)

### Baby tests Covid +ve at Niloufer

# Marginal rise in Hyd crime rate

Barring an increase in cybercrimes and crimes against women, the crime rate in Hyderabad in 2023 emained nearly identical to last year. A total of 24,821 cases were registered this year compared to 21,795 last Hyderabad Police Com-

missioner K Sreenivasa Reddy said the increase in cybercrimes was a global phenomenon and due to the rise in usage of the internet, cybercrimes cases were increasing all over. The increase in crimes against women, he said, was because the means of report-

ing such crimes have multiplied. "Instant registration of cases is done. Zero FIR concepts are also being implemented. So there is an increase in the number of cases registered in the city," the Commissioner said. He

# BRS' white paper to counter Cong

Taking to social media, Rama Rao termed Telangana's progress in the last nine-and-half years as a



He reiterated that the party will not remain silent under any circumstances if any attempts are made to insult Telangana or portray it as a failed State.

### 'Human trafficking': Flight with 303 Indians grounded

French officials grounded a flight from the UAE to Nicaragua carrying 303 Indian passengers after receiving a tipoff that it could be carrying victims of human trafficking, prosecutors said. Special investigators are questioning all those aboard and two people are in custody.

# Karnataka lifts ban on *hijab*

Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah on Friday said the restrictions on wearing hijab (headscarf) in educational institutions in the State will be lifted from Saturday, saying the choice of dress and food is personal and no one should interfere in it.

Speaking at the inauguration of three police stations in Nanjangud in Mysuru district, the Chief Minister said no one should indulge in vote bank politics.

Lashing out at the BJP, Siddaramaiah said, "They say 'Sabka Sath, Sabka Vikas' but sidelining those wearing caps, burqa and sporting beard. Is this what they mean?" When someone in the crowd asked about restrictions on wear-

(restrictions). You can wear Hijab. I have instructed (the officials) that there will be no restriction from tomorrow onwards. You can wear and eat whatever you want. It's up to you." "... your choices are yours and my choices are mine. It's that simple," he said.

"I wear dhoti and kurta,

and you wear pant and shirt. It's your choice. What's wrong in this?" he asked. Affirming that the Congress party does not indulge in politics for votes, he said, government "Congress came to power to protect the rights of the poor, BCs, Dalits and minorities. There is no question of compromising on this." Referring to the five guarantees, he

### Six killed in two separate accidents

Six people were killed in two separate incidents on Friday. In the first incident, four people were killed and three others injured when the car in which they were travelling in collided headon with a lorry at Penchikalpet crossroad on the Hanamkonda-Karimnagar National Highway near Elkaturthy on Friday.
