Cracks in I.N.D.I.A bloc widen

Congress, TMC spar over seat-sharing

Sending out tell-tale hints of a further deepening of cracks in the Opposition bloc — I.N.D.I.A — as the Lok Sabha elections near, the West Bengal unit of the Congress on Thursday took a swipe at the Trinamool Congress, blaming the ruling party in the State for the lack of progress in seat-sharing talks.

Further opening up fissures in the Opposition bloc at a time when divergent voices over seat-sharing have come to the fore, Congress MP and the party's West Bengal chief Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury on Thursday hit out at TMC Supremo and Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, voice doubts over her intent to go into a seat allotment with the grand old party in the State.

Addressing a press conference in the Murshidabad district of West Bengal on Thursday, Adhir also scoffed at Mamata's rumoured offer of 2 of the State's 42 Lok Sabha seats to the Congress, saying those constituencies are already with the Congress and his party was quite capable of retaining them in the polls that are likely to be scheduled in the summer.

Adhir Ranjan slams Mamata, voices doubts over her intent to go into a seat allotment with the Congress in **West Bengal**

"The true face of Mamata Banerjee is out. They (TMC) are saving that they are ready to give us two seats in West Bengal. The seats in question are already with us. Both these constituencies elected Congress MPs. So, what new are they giving us? We won these seats defeating Mamata Banerjee's TMC and the BJP. Are they doing us a favour? Who will trust her (Mamata) with seat allotment?" Adhir said. A key constituent of the I.N.D.I.A bloc, the TMC has reportedly proposed 2 seats for the Congress to contest in the general elections. In a further dig at the ruling party in the State, Adhir said he needed no favour from the TMC as his party was quite capable of going solo in the State. (SEE PAGE 2)

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister YS Jaganmohan Reddy on Thursday called on BRS president and former Chief Minister K Chandrashekhar Rao who is recuperating after undergoing hip replacement surgery last month. Jaganmohan met the former Chief Minister of Telangana at the latter's residence in Nandinagar in Hyderabad here and enquired about his health.

Jaganmohan arrived at the Begumpet airport at around 11.15 pm on a special flight. Former Minister Vemula Prashanth Reddy, MLAs Palla Rajeshwar Reddy, Danam Nagender and others received him at the airport. Upon his arrival at Chandrashekhar Rao's residence in Nandinagar, BRS working president KT Rama Rao and others extended a warm welcome.

Later, the Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister met Chandrashekhar Rao and presented

him with a shawl and bouquet as well as a statue of Lord Venkateswara Swamy, wishing for his speedy recovery. He enquired about the latter's health condition and ongoing treatment, following the total hip re-

placement surgery.

BRS sources said the meeting was a courtesy call in the wake of Chandrashekhar Rao's recent surgery and had no other significance. After spending an hour with the former Chief Minister and other BRS leaders, Jaganmohan left for his residence at Lotus Pond and later to Vijayawada. Jaganmohan was accompanied by YSR Congress party MP Mithun Reddy, MLC Raghuram, MLA Chevireddy Bhaskar Reddy and others. BRS leaders, including former Ministers Talasani Srinivas Yadav, Mohd Mahmood Ali, Rajya Sabha MP J Santosh Kumar and

others were also present. It may be noted that Jaganmohan had called Rama Rao soon after learning about Chandrashekhar Rao's surgery and wished for his speedy recovery. TDP chief and former Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu also called on the BRS Chandrababu supremo at the hospital immediately after the latter underwent

Qatar: Legal team gets 60 days to appeal

The legal team of eight jailed former Indian Navy personnel was given 60 days to appeal against the ruling by Qatar's court of appeal, the Ministry of External Affairs said. Last month, the Court of Appeal in Qatar commuted the death sentence handed down to the Indians and sentenced them to prison for varying durations.

The verdict came weeks after the family members of the Indians filed an apagainst the earliei order by another court. Sixty days' time has been given to file an appeal against the order at Qatar's highest court, External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said at a media briefing. PTI

Blood banks can only charge processing fee

NEW DELHI

Hospitals and blood banks can now only charge processing fee for blood as the apex drug regulator has decided to do away with all other fee to check the practice of overcharging.

In a communication to all States and UT drugs controllers cum licensing authorities, the Drugs Controller General of India (DCGI) stated that the decision was taken in view of the opinion that "blood is not for sale.'

Referring to the 62nd meeting of the Drugs Consultative Committee held on September 26, 2023, the DCGI in the letter on December 26 said, "It was recommended with respect of agenda No. 18 of ATR point 3, for overcharging of blood, it was opined that blood is not for sale, it is only for supply and only processing cost may be charged by the blood centre." The revised guidelines stipulate that only processing fees can be charged for blood or blood components which ranges between Rs 250 to 1,550 for blood or blood components. The DCGI has asked States/ UTs to direct all blood centres under their jurisdiction to adhere to the revised guidelines. PTI

RTC to run 4,484 Sankranti specials

The Telangana State Road Corporation (TSRTC) has arranged 4,484 special buses for people heading to their hometowns during Sankranti festivities. These buses will run from January 6 to 15 from Hyderabad to various destinations in Telangana and neighbouring States of Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Maharashtra.

The free travel facility for women will also be applica-ble in these special buses but only till State borders. TSRTC Managing Director VC Sajjanar said all necessary arrangements have been made to take citizens

safely to their destinations for Sankranti and measures are in place to ensure that passengers do not face any inconvenience. "We are running special buses with regular fares without any hike," he said.

Special campsThe TSRTC authorities

have also set up special camps for passengers waiting to board buses in usually congested areas where passenger traffic is high such as Uppal Crossroad, LB Nagar, Aramghar and KPHB. "Drinking water, mobile bio-toilets are other facilities have been arranged for the comfort of passengers in places where required," Sajjanar said.
