PM calls for installation of rooftop solar panels

at zero power

Govt aiming

Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that the government is working to bring the electricity bills of the households to zero. While unveiling several key projects in Assam, Modi said, "We have run programmes to install electricity connections in every household in the country. Now we have planned to make the electricity bills zero."

He said that setting up rooftop solar power plants for 1 crore households in the country will pave the way towards achieving zero power bills. "In the Budget, we have announced plans to put rooftop solar panels in 1 crore houses. This will not only bring down the electricity bills to zero, the people can have their own electricity generation system in their homes. They can even sell the electricity generated through solar power rooftop systems to earn money," Modi said in a massive public rally here.

He said that the announcements were made in the latest Budget of the Union government to invest at least Rs 11 lakh crore in in-

frastructure development in the next one year. "Prior to 2014, the Central government used to spend 12 lakh crore on infrastructure in 10 years. We have set a target to invest almost an equal amount of money in just one year. Last year, I announced to produce 2 crore Lakhpati Didi in the country. In just a year, we could have made 1 crore women as Lakhpati. In this year's Budget, we have stretched the aim and now we will make a total of 3 crore women as Lakhpati Didi," he said.

Modi said that some of the Lakhpati Didis also came to attend his rally in Guwahati on Sunday. He also took an indirect jibe at former Prime Minister

Manmohan Singh. "Earlier, the roads in Assam were so horrible that people could find it hard to travel from one district to another. There were continuous roadblocks and agitation despite the fact that the then Prime Minister of the country was known to be associated with Assam," he said. "But the situation has massively changed in the last 10 years. Assam and northeast will become a hub of trade in the upcoming years," he added.

Addressing a massive rally in Guwahati after unveiling infrastructure projects worth Rs 11,600 crore, Modi said no country can progress by erasing its past. On the Kamakhya temple corridor project, to be developed by the Centre at a cost of Rs 498 crore, he said a huge number of devotees will come to visit the 'Shakti Peeth' once it is ready and it will boost the tourism sector of the entire Northeast.

"Despite thousands of years of challenges, pilgrimage sites and temples are the symbols of our culture and how we have stood firm. Many of these symbols, which are part of our strong culture, have become ruins nowadays," Modi said.

BRS misleading on projects, says Revanth

Asserting that the Congress government did not hand over any of the Krishna Basin irrigation projects to the KRMB, Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy on Sunday accused former Chief Minister K Chandrashekhar Rao and former Minister T Harish Rao of spreading misleading information.

He alleged that it was the previous BRS government that initiated proceedings to hand over the Nagarjuna Sagar and Sri-sailam projects to the KRMB.

Challenging Chandrashekhar Rao for a debate on the handing

over of the irrigation projects during the forthcoming Assembly session, Revanth Reddy said a white paper would be released on the irrigation sector. Every aspect, including handing over of projects would be discussed in detail for two days and if need be, more time would be allowed, he said. Accusing the previous government of ignoring Telangana's interests in the sharing of River Krishna water, he alleged that Chandrashekhar Rao had given his nod to handing over the sharing of Krishna and Godavari waters to the Centre when the AP State Reorganization Act was formulated.

Ready for debate, CM is clueless, says Harish

Accepting the challenge thrown by Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy for a debate in the Assembly on the handing over of irrigation projects, BRS MLA and former Minister T Harish Rao said his party would give a befitting reply that would leave Congress leaders fumbling for answers.

Responding to the Chief Minister while speaking at the BRS LB Nagar Assembly constituency meeting, Harish Rao said that during the ten years of the BRS regime, notwithstanding the pressure exerted by the Centre, no irri-

gation project was handed over to the KRMB. "We laid down the condition that 50 per cent share of water should be given, Srisailam should be recognised as a hydel project and only 20 per cent of drinking water should be taken into account. Not even two months in office, the Congress government has handed over the projects putting the interests of the people of Telangana at stake," he said, stating that Revanth Reddy had no knowledge of the subject and was hence spitting venom.

Wasn't it the Congress that passed the Bill to hand over the projects to the Centre during State bifurcation he asked.

Drop Paytm,

Confederation of All India Traders on Sunday issued a cautionary advisory to traders to switch from Paytm to other payment options for business-related transactions following RBI curbs on Paytm wallet and bank operations.
