Govt to implement digital literacy programme, says Governor

Governor Tamilisai Soundararajan, addressing the State Legislative Assembly and Council at the joint Budget session that began here on Thursday, said the Telangana government would soon introduce Internet as a basic right. The focus would not just be to create digital infrastructure but also to make it accessible and affordable to all sections of society. The government would

implement a thorough, digital literacy programme to ensure that every household, regardless of its economic status or location, would be able to benefit from the rapid digital adoption of opportunities that are arising, she said, also stating that it would position Hyderabad and Telangana as the Artificial Intelligence (AI) capital of the country by inviting top global and national technology companies to set up AI

centres here. "We will set up a dedicated AI City in 50-100 acres," she said.

Earlier, the Governor said as promised during the elections, the government was committed to realising the six guarantees. Pointing out that two guarantees were already being implemented, she said over 15 crore trips were already utilised by women through the free TSRTC bus transportation services under the Maha Lakshmi Scheme. The government would implement two more guarantees very soon under the scheme, which would be LPG cylinders to eligible families for

Congress to present vote-on-account Budget

Pegged at Rs 3 lakh cr; full Budget in July-Aug

With a marginal hike of four to five per cent over last year's Rs 2.9 lakh-crore Budget, the State government is likely to present a vote-on-account Budget for 2024-25 in the Telangana State Legislative Assembly on Saturday. The Budget is

pegged at Rs 3 lakh crore. Deputy Chief Minister and Finance Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka will present the debut State Budget of the Congress government with a full Budget for the 2024-25 fiscal likely to be presented later this year in Ĵuly-August.

Under Article 116 of the Constitution, a vote-on-account is presented to meet essential government expenditure for a limited period until the Budget is approved. It is generally presented by a government in an election year to cover short-term expenditure requirements before the new fiscal begins. Recently, the newly elected Rajasthan government also opted for a vote-on-account Budget.



RBI keeps interest rate unchanged

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Thursday decided to keep the policy rate unchanged for the sixth time in a row given global uncertainty and the need to bring down retail inflation to 4 per cent.

Following the RBI's decision to maintain the status quo, banks and financial institutions will largely keep lending rates stable. The RBI had last raised the repo rate in February 2023 to 6.5 per cent after six consecutive rate hikes aggregating to 250 basis points since May 2022. Announcing the decision of the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC), RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das said it has decided to keep the policy repo rate unchanged based on an assessment of the current and evolving macroeconomic situation. Seats in professional courses only for locals from 2025

The clock is ticking for the students of Andhra Pradesh, who have a final opportunity to secure admissions in professional courses in Telangana for this academic year 2024-25.

Post June 2, 2024, the students will not have access to seats in professional courses in Hyderabad, as the common admissions between the two Teluguspeaking States cease to be operational and entire seats in professional courses are expected to be filled with Telangana locals. This will formally mark the end of the 10-year common admissions era between two the States.

For this academic year, however, the State government will continue common admissions for both TS and AP students, as laid down in the Andhra Pradesh Reor-

ganisation Act 2014 for only this year. The government took this decision since notifications, including the Telangana State Engineering, Agriculture and Pharmacy Common Entrance

Test (TS EAPCET), Engineering Common Entrance Test (ECET) and Post Graduate Engineering Common Entrance Test (PGECET), have been issued before June 2, 2024.

The AP Reorganisation Act 2014, during the bifurcation of erstwhile AP, had mandated the continuation of the common admission process provided under Article 371 D of the Constitution for both successor States — Telangana and AP — for a period of 10 years

starting June 2, 2014. As per the common admission norm, 85 per cent of the seats in higher educational institutions in the State have been reserved for Osmania University area (Telangana) locals and the remaining, i.e., 15 per cent, is open for all. This means, students from TS and AP can compete for a seat in the 15% quota.
