LPG scheme: 40 lakh consumers to benefit

Chief Minister to launch initiative today

Nearly 40 lakh consumers in Telangana are eligible to obtain LPG cylinders at the subsidised price of Rs 500 under the Maha Lakshmi scheme. While beneficiaries are mandated to have ration cards, only a limited number of cylinders will be supplied to each consumer based on their previous consumption. Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy will launch the initia tive along with the Gruha Jyothi scheme for a free power supply of 200 units to domestic consumers on Tuesday.

As per the guidelines issued, the beneficiaries must have both a ration card and also an LPG connection. Eligible individuals should have already submitted their Praja Palana application. There are 1.25 crore LPG connections against over 90 lakh ration cards in Telangana. The Civil Supplies Department initially estimated the number of total beneficiaries to be around 65 lakh. But now, fresh estimates have pegged the number at nearly 40 lakh. Interestingly, this includes around 11.58 lakh beneficiaries under the Pradhan Mantri Ujjwal Yojana scheme where the Centre provides a subsidy of Rs

340 per LPG cylinder. Further, the consumers should pay the entire amount of around Rs 955 upfront. Of this, the subsidy amount of Rs 40 from the Central government and another Rs 415 from the

State government will be reimbursed through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) into the bank accounts of the consumers. For beneficiaries under the Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana, the State government will reimburse only the excess amount above the Rs 340 subsidy from the Centre and the Rs 500 paid by consumers.

To prevent misuse of the scheme, the Civil Supplies Department has mapped all the beneficiaries and decided to restrict the annual number of LPG cylinders supplied under the scheme to the average number of cylinders procured by the customer in the last three years. "If the consumers

purchased an average of five cylinders per annum in the last three years, S/he will be eligible to receive five subsidised cylinders. Similarly, those who consumed eight or nine cylinders will be able to receive an equal number of cylinders," a top official of the Civil Supplies department told 'Telangana Today.'

'Many Indians discharged from Russia'

MEA says actively pursuing with Russian army

Several Indians, who worked as support staff to the Russian army, were 'discharged' following India's demand, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said on Monday. It said India remains committed, as a matter of "top priority", to actively pursuing with the Russian authorities all the relevant cases of Indian nationals for an early discharge from the Russian

army. According to media reports, several Indians have been working as security helpers in the Russian military, and they were forced to even fight with Russian soldiers in certain areas along Russia's border with Ukraine. "We have seen some inaccurate reports in the media regarding Indians with the Russian army seeking help for discharge," the MEA said in a statement.

"Each and every such case brought to the attention of the Indian embassy in Moscow has been strongly taken up with the Russian authorities and those brought to the attention of the Ministry have been taken up with the Whereabouts of **TS youth unknown**

HYDERABAD: Syed Sufivan of Narayanpet is one among a few Indian youths, who are in the Russia-Ukraine war zone after being duped by agents in the guise of providing security guard jobs. The family members

of the 23-year-old say that Sufiyan has not communicated with them from Russia for over 20 days now. Sufiyan was working as a helper in the packing section at Dubai airport when he reportedly came in contact with Faizal Khan, an agent in Dubai, who allegedly promised Sufiyan a security guard job in Russia and said he needed to undergo some physical training to get (SEE PAGE 2) the job.

Russian embassy in New Delhi," it said. The MEA added, "Several Indians have already been discharged as a result."

Jaiswal said New Delhi was in touch with Moscow for early "discharge" of Indians working as support staff to the Russian Army and urged its nationals to stay away from the conflict zone in Ukraine. "We urge all Indian nationals to exercise due caution and stay away from this conflict," he had said.

AIMIM chief Asaduddin Owaisi had urged the Ministry to rescue the Indians. In a related development, the Jammu and Kashmir Students Association said it wrote to External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and Lt Governor Manoj Sinha, seeking their intervention for repatriation of two youths "trapped" in Russia.

It said one youth is trapped along the Russia-Ukraine border and another reportedly missing within Russia. In a statement, the national convener of the association, Nasir Khuehami, said that Azad Yusuf Kumar and several others have been ensnared in a fraudulent recruitment scheme, wherein they were de-ceived into travelling to Russia under false promises of job opportunities in cooking and cleaning.

Clear LRS applications: CM

Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy on Monday directed officials to expedite the processing of Layout Regularisation Scheme (LRS) 2020 applications and facilitate applicants to get the layouts

regularised before March 31 on payment of the full fee. Instructions were issued

to officials to regularise layouts other than those belonging to Endowments, Waqf, government and those covered under court directions. These decisions were taken during a meeting

at the Secretariat. The previous government had accepted LRS applications from August 31 to October 31, 2020. Around 25.44 lakh applications were submitted from all panchayats, municipalities and corporations in the State.

Politician's son among ten held with drugs

The Cyberabad SOT, along with local police, arrested ten persons on charges of drug consumption at a party in a star hotel in Gachibowli on Monday. Police seized three used plastic covers of cocaine, each cover containing one gram, and white papers used for usage of the drugs.

The arrested were identified Vivekanand (37), Director of the Manjeera Group of companies and son of a prominent politician, Syed Abbas Ali Jeffery, Nirbhay, Kedhar and six others. According to the police, on receiving information about the usage of drugs by Vivekanand with his friends, the police teams visited the hotel. On examination of the premises, the teams found three used plastic sachets of cocaine and other material.
