

Troops fire on Palestinians waiting for aid in Gaza city



HYDERABAD: In a strategic move to combat the misinformation campaign by the Congress government regarding the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Scheme, the BRS will embark on its 'Chalo Medigadda' programme on Friday. Israeli troops fired on a crowd of Palestinians waiting for aid in Gaza City on

Thursday, witnesses said, killing more than 100 people and bringing the death toll since the start of the Israel-Hamas war to over 30,000, according to health officials. Hospital officials initially reported an Israeli strike on the crowd, but witnesses later said the troops opened fire as people pulled flour and canned goods off of trucks. Israeli officials acknowledged that troops opened fire, saying they did

so after the crowd ap-proached in a threatening way. The officials insisted on anonymity to give details about what happened, after the military said in a state-

ment that "dozens were killed and injured from pushing, trampling and being run over by the trucks".

Trucks carrying food reached northern Gaza this week, the first major aid delivery to the area in a month, officials said on Wednesday. Kamel Abu Nahel, who was being treated for a gunshot wound at Shifa Hospital, said he and others went to the distribution point in the middle of the night because they heard there would be a delivery of food. "We've been eating animal feed for two months," he said. He said Israeli troops

opened fire on the crowd, causing it to scatter, with some people hiding under cars. (SEE PAGE 2)

Powers decentralised for speedy disposal of Dharani applications

or the speedy disposal of pending applications on Dharani, the State government has now partially decentralised powers to make changes in specific modules of the portal.

A total of 16 modules have been identified for quick disposal in the first phase, at the level of the Tahsildar, Revenue Divisional Officer, District Collector and Chief Commissioner of Land Administration.

Further, a revenue special drive will be conducted at all Tahsildar offices across the State from March 1-9.

All District Collectors have been directed to form two-three teams in every Tahsildar office to scrutinise the pending applications, conduct field inspection and prepare reports within a stipulated timeframe. The special teams, comprising revenue officials, parale-

gals and community surveyors working in DRDAs, Agriculture Extension Officers and Panchayat Secretaries, will verify all types of land records, including Setwar, Khasra Pahani, Sessala Pahani, old Pahanies, 1B register and Dharani portal, as well as details pertaining to assignment, inam, PoT reg-

isters, Bhoodan, Wakf and endowment land. District Collectors have been instructed to provide the Tahsildar office teams with access to pending applications and the documents submitted along with those applications. The team leads will ensure that information is given to applicants through village-level officers or WhatsApp/

phone/SMS. Based on the

verification, the teams

will prepare reports on

each application recommending acceptance or rejection.

While the Tahsildars and District Collectors have been directed to dispose of the applications in seven days, the RDOs and Additional Collectors (Revenue) must dispose them in three days.

"The special drive is being conducted based on the suggestions made by the Dharani Committee and to bail farmers and other applicants out of their problems. The grievances, which can be resolved without much complication, will be disposed of immediately. Based on the reports submitted by the District Collectors and disposal of the applications, pending applications pertaining to certain complex issues will be disposed of in the next phase," a top official in the Revenue Department said. ONE-MINUTE-LATE RULE COSTS STUDENT'S LIFE IN ADILABAD

ADILABAD: A second-year Intermediate student reportedly jumped to death into an irrigation project after he was refused entry into the exam hall citing the one-minute-late rule at Sathnala village in Jainath mandal on Thursday Jainath Inspector D Sainath said Shiva Kumar (17) was found dead in the project waters. He was a student of a government junior college at Jainath mandal centre and a resident of Mangurla village. Shiva was to appear for the Inter second-year second language examination. However, it is learned that he could not reach the venue on time despite hiring an auto-rickshaw from his village. The autorickshaw driver alerted his parents when he saw Shiva gloomy after being denied entry into the exam centre, which he should have reached by 9 am. In a suicide note, Shiva said he was dejected for being late, which he said was for the first time in his life. He was also upset for failing in three subjects in the first year. A case was registered.

CENTRE CLEARS RS 1.26 LAKH CR CHIP-MAKING UNITS

NEW DELHI: The Union Cabinet on Thursday approved setting up three semiconductor-making units by firms, including Tata Group and Japan's Renesas, at an investment of Rs 1.26 lakh crore as part of an attempt to cut India's dependence on imports to meet requirements of chips. The units which will make chips for sectors, including defence, automobiles and telecommunications, will begin construction in the next 100 days, Telecom Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said after the Cabinet meeting. The three units will be set up under the 'Development of Semiconductors and Display Manufacturing Ecosystem' programme that provides government support of up to Rs 76,000 crore. Tata Electronics Pvt Ltd will set up a semiconductor fab in partnership with Taiwan's Powerchip Semiconductor Manufacturing Corp at Dholera, Gujarat. It will have a capacity to make 50,000 wafers per month. PTI


Notification for 11,062 teacher posts released

Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy released the DSC notification for filling 11,062 teacher posts in the State. Roads and Buildings Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy and other senior officials were also present on the occasion

The State government issued GO Ms 96 on August 25 last year to fill 5,089 teacher posts under various categories, including SAs, SGTs, LPs and PETs. Accordingly, the Commissioner of School Education, Telangana, issued the DSC-2023 Notification on September 6, 2023, for the 5,089 posts.

Another GO was issued on Monday to fill 4,957 Direct Recruitment teacher posts under various categories in government and local body schools in the State. The Finance Department permitted to fill 796 Special Education Teacher posts at the primary level and 220 Special Education



Teacher posts in the upper primary/secondary level in government and local body schools in the State, totalling 11,062 Direct Recruitment posts for DSC-2024. In view of the above, the State government decided to cancel the teacher recruitment of the DSC-2023 Notification for 5,089 vacan-

cies and, accordingly, issued a comprehensive fresh notification. All candidates, who applied in response to the earlier notification, need not worry, officials said, adding their applications that would be automatically carried forward in the fresh notification. They need not apply again. (SEE PAGE 2)
