CAA comes into force

Centre notifies rules for contentious law

NEW DELHI

Ahead of the Lok Sabha election, the Centre on Monday announced the implementation of the con-Citizenship (Amendment) Act, 2019 for granting citizenship to undocumented non-Muslim migrants from Pakistan, Bangladesh and Afghanistan who came to India before

With the CAA rules being issued, the Modi government will now start granting Indian nationality to persecuted non-Muslim migrants - Hindus, Sikhs, Jains, Buddhists, Parsis and Christians — from the three countries.

December 31, 2014.

The CAA was passed in December 2019 and subsequently got the President's assent but there were protests in several parts of the country against it. The law could not come into effect as rules had not been notified till now.

"These rules, called the Citizenship (Amendment) Rules, 2024 will enable the persons eligible under CAA-2019 to apply for the grant of Indian citizenship," Home Ministry spokesperson said. "The ap-

plications will be submitted in a completely online mode for which a web portal has been provided," spokesperson added. According to the Manual

Disclose poll bonds today: SC

Apex court dismisses SBI's plea for extension of deadline

NEW DELHI

Chastising the SBI, the Supreme Court on Monday ordered it to disclose the details of the electoral bonds encashed by political parties to the Election Commission by the close of business hours on Tuesday and warned the country's largest public sector lender that the court may proceed against it for "wilful disobedience" if it failed to comply with its directions and deadlines.

A five-judge Constitution Bench headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud, while

dismissing the State Bank of India's (SBI) plea seeking an extension till June 30 to disclose the details, also directed the EC to publish the information shared by the bank on its official website by 5 pm on March 15. The order was passed by the
