"These microcontrollers are housed in secured unauthorised access modules so they cannot be accessed physically also," an ECI official submitted before a Bench presided over by Justice Sanjiv Khanna. IANS

## RBI imposes curbs on Kotak bank

Cracking down on repeated non-compliance of IT norms, the RBI on Wednesday barred Kotak Mahindra Bank from onboarding new customers through its online and mobile banking channels and issuing fresh credit cards with immediate effect after the regulator found "serious deficiencies" in the lender's IT risk management.

These actions, the RBI said, are necessitated based on significant concerns arising out of the Reserve Bank's IT examination of the bank for 2022 and 2023 and the continued failure on part of the bank to address these concerns in a comprehensive and timely manner.

In an almost similar action, the RBI in December 2020 had barred HDFC digital initiatives after reonboarding new customers online, issuing new credit cards after finding gaps in IT inventory

In a statement regarding the supervisory action against Kotak Mahindra Bank, the apex bank stated that: "Serious deficiencies and non-compliances were observed in the areas of IT inventory management, patch and change management, user access management, vendor risk management, data security and data leak prevention strategy, business continuity and disaster recovery rigour and drill, etc." PT

According to the Indian Institute of Astrophysics (IIA), the Sun does not rise exactly in the east and set exactly in the west every day. It also does not rise directly overhead at noon and does not reach its highest point at noon every day.

As a result, the elevation of the Sun at its maximum height also varies throughout the year.
