Extreme heat grips northwest India

NEW DELHI: The extreme heat scorching large parts of northwest India will continue for another five days, with Delhi, Haryana, Punjab, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh predicted to bear the maximum impact. A brutal heat wave swept swathes of north India on Friday, with the maximum temperature soaring to 47.4 degrees Celsius in Delhi's Najafgarh, highest this season in the country so far.

TS realtors oppose market value revision

Say move may hit realty hard which is already witnessing slump

Will the State government's proposed move to revise market values hit the real estate sector in Telangana, which is already witnessing a slump?

Builders and developers are apprehensive over the move, which became a topic of discussion after a recent review meeting by Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy with an eye on shoring up revenues. They fear that the revision of market values at this particular point in time could further slow down business, which has been going through a slump ever since elections were announced late last year. The State government's policies are still unclear on different issues, builders feel, saying that considering all these factors, it might not be the right time to take up such exercises.



Bishkek mob violence: Indian students safe

Shifted to hostels run by Indian consultancies

Amidst reports of escalating tension and attacks on foreigners in Kyrgyzstan's capital city Bishkek, scores of Indian students living in private accommodations were shifted to hostels run by Indian consultancies.

"All the Indian students are safe and none of them is harmed. Parents of students need not worry about the safety of their children," Ramakrishna, coordinator of Indian students at Kyrgyz State Medical Academy told 'Telangana Today' over the phone from Bishkek on Sat-

Students, whom this reporter spoke to, maintained that after a brawl between local students, Pakistanis and Egyptians, the local students began targetting the foreign students. "Initially, they attacked all foreign students as they believed that Kyrgyz authorities were lenient towards foreigners," they said on the condition of anonymity.

However, later the local students began enquiring about the nationality of the students and by and large did not target the Indians. There are over 2,000 students from Telangana and

Students told to stay indoors

NEW DELHI: India on Saturday asked its students in Bishkek to stay indoors after the Kyrgyz capital city reported fights between some locals and foreigners. The Indian embassy in the Central Asian country said it is in touch with the Indian students and the situation is 'calm" now. External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar advised the Indian students to stay in regular touch with the Indian embassy. PTI

Kejri's aide held in Maliwal case

Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's aide Bibhav Kumar was arrested on Saturday in assault on AAP MP Swati Maliwal, even as the party claimed she was "blackmailed" by the BJP as she faces a corruption case.

Kumar was picked up from the Chief Minister's residence by a Delhi Police team, a senior police officer said, a day after Maliwal recorded her statement before a magistrate at the Tis Hazari court.

A senior police officer said Kumar was arrested from the Chief Minister's residence on Saturday. The officer said Kumar had gone there in the morning to meet Kejriwal. "He will be produced before a court and police will seek his custody for further interrogation," the officer said. Police said they have recorded the statement of at least 10 people, including security personnel and other staff at the Chief Minister's residence, who were present at the time of the alleged assault on May 13. Earlier in the day,

On Friday, Kumar filed a police complaint, alleging Maliwal breached the security of the CM's residence to gain unauthorised entry on May 13 and created a ruckus there. Property row: Man kills mom, daughters

In a barbaric incident, a man allegedly killed his mother and his two daughters at Gopalpet village in the dis-

trict on Saturday.

It was said that the accused, Pittala Venkateshwarlu, strangled his mother P Pichamma (60), and his daughters Neeraja (10) and Jhansi (6) to death. He was also suspected of killing his wife, Kanakadurga, who died under suspicious circumstances on May 31, 2022. but no case was

booked against him. According to locals, after the death of his wife, the accused married another woman, Triveni, and was living in Khammam. He reportedly was harassing his mother for some time now, forcing her to register a house, in which she was living now at the village, on his name besides one acre of agricultural land.

Pichamma, however, with the help of the villagers transferred the property rights of the house to her granddaughters, who were being taken care of by her after the death of their mother. Of the one acre, half an acre was registered on the name of Pichamma and the remaining half on the names of the children as her son was said to be a drunkard.

The accused, who wanted to own the properties, got angry at his mother's move and resorted to the inhuman act, the villagers suspected. The local police visited the spot following information from the villagers, booked a case and took up investigation. Two police teams have been formed to nab the ac-

3 realtors held for Rs 60 crore scam

Three realtors, who collected Rs 50-60 crore from investors under the pretext of 'pre-launch offers' with false promise of constructing residential apartments in Kompally locality, were arrested by the Cyberabad Police on Saturday.

The arrested include the chairman of Bharathi Builders, Dupati Nagaraju, MD of the company, Mulpury Shivarama Krishna and CEO, Thoddakula Narasimha Rao, according to an official press release.

According to police officials, Nagaraju and Shivarama Krishna floated 'Bharathi Builders' in 2021 and acquired 6.23 acres in Kompally and planned to construct residential apartments in the name of 'Bharathi Lake View'.

They collected huge deposits from prospective buyers through 'pre-launch offer' at a price of Rs 3,200 per sft by publishing colourful brochures and conducting meetings at the venture in Kompally and their office in Madhapur. (SEE PAGE 2)
