The ongoing investigations into the Medigadda barrage, irrespective of their findings and the end results, will not be final.

The Telangana government, which discussed the issue during the Cabinet meeting on Monday, is firm on conducting further investigations in all three barrages of the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project for taking up rehabilitation works on a permanent basis, which, in turn, could mean that the repairs could take longer than expected.

Three central organisations — the National Geophysical Research Institute (NGRI), Central Water and Power Research Station (WPRS) and Central Mechanical Engineering Research Institute (CMERI) are in consideration for further investigations, accord-

ing to irrigation officials. Issues such as suspected construction deficiencies, design discrepancies, maintenance neglect and settlement of the barrage raft have been under the scrutiny of the National Dam Safety Authority

Iranian President Raisi, Foreign Minister killed in chopper crash

Country's first Vice President Mokhber named acting President

Iranian President Ebrahim Raisi, the country's Foreign Minister and seven other officials were found dead on Monday, hours after their helicopter crashed in a foggy, mountainous region of the country's northwest, state media reported.

Despite severe burns, all occupants have been identified, a high-ranking government representative told Iranian news agency Tasnim. Their bodies have been transferred to Tabriz, the

capital of Iran's East Azerbaijan province.

The crash comes as the Middle East remains unsettled by the Israel-Hamas war, during which Raisi, who was 63, under Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei launched an unprecedented drone-and-missile attack on Israel just last month.

Khamenei, hours later, announced that Iran's first Vice President Mohammad Mokhber would serve as the country's acting President until elections are held.

State TV gave no immediate cause for the crash that occurred in Iran's East Azerbaijan province. Among the dead was Iranian Foreign Minister Hossein Amirabdollahian (60). The helicopter also carried the Governor of Iran's East Azerbaijan province, other officials and bodyguards, the state-run IRNA reported.

Condolences started pouring in from neighbours and allies. Prime Minister Narendra Modi said in a post on X that India "stands with Iran in this time of sor-

row". External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar also condoled Raisi's death. "Deeply shocked to hear of the passing away of Iran's President Dr Ebrahim Raisi and Foreign Minister H Amir-Abdollahian in the helicopter crash. Recall my many meetings with them, most recently in January. Our condolences to their families. We stand with the people of Iran at the time of this tragedy," he posted on X. 4 IS terrorists from Lanka arrested in Ahmedabad

Former Health Minister T Harish Rao on Monday criticised the State government for not paying salaries for the last six months to doctors and staff of Telangana Diagnostics centres.

He demanded that the government immediately address the issue and ensure all medical services are provided to people through these centres.

Sharing news reports about the pending salaries on social media on Monday, Harish expressed disappointment over the deterioration of Telangana Diagnostics under the Congress government. "It is sad the Telangana Diagnostics system, started during BRS regime to conduct free medical tests for people, collapsed in five months under Congress rule," he (SEE PAGE 2)

The Gujarat Anti-Terrorist Squad (ATS) has arrested four Sri Lankans with links to the banned outfit Islamic State (IS), who were allegedly on a mission to carry out terror activities in India,

police said on Monday.

Acting on a tipoff, the
ATS apprehended the accused at the Sardar Vallabhai Patel airport here after they travelled from Sri Lanka's capital Colombo via Chennai on Sunday night, an official said.

The men travelled to India to carry out terror activities at the behest of IS, Director General of Police Vikas Sahay said. The ATS also recovered three Pakistan-made pistols and 20 cartridges lying abandoned at a location in the city's Nana Chiloda area based on geo-coordinates and photographs found on the mobile phone seized from the accused, Sahay said.

The men were allegedly directed by their Pakistani handler to collect these weapons, he said. The accused - Mohammad Nus-Mohammad (35),Faarukh (35), Mohammad Nafran (27) and Mohammad Rasdeen (43) — took a flight from Colombo and reached Chennai early on Sunday. They then took another flight to Ahmedabad, where they landed around 8 pm on Sunday, the official said.

The men informed investigators that they were earlier associated with the banned Sri Lankan radical militant outfit, National Thowheeth Jamath (NJT), and joined IS after getting in touch with Pakistani handler Abu Bakr Al Bagdadi,

They are members of IS radicalised by a leader from Sri Lanka who is living in Pakistan, Sahay said.

Two burglars dressed as women break into apartment

Two burglars dressed as women entered into an apartment at SR Nagar and decamped with gold and cash, police said.

Two get death for raping, burning girl alive in Rajasthan

A POCSO court in Rajasthan's Bhilwara district on Monday awarded death sentence to two men for raping and burning alive a minor girl in a coal furnace last year. "Kalu and Kanha were awarded death penalty by the court," Special Public Prosecutor Mahaveer Singh Kishnawat said. The court on Saturday convicted Kalu and Kanha for the crime that took place in August last year. Seven others accused of destroying evidence were acquitted by the court. Kishnawat said the acquittal will be challenged in the High Court. The 14year-old went missing while she took cattle for grazing. The two accused raped and threw her into a coal furnace. PTI

HC UPHOLDS DEATH PENALTY IN RAPE-MURDER OF DALIT STUDENT

KOCHI: The Kerala High Court on Monday upheld the death sentence given by a sessions court to perpetrator Muhammed Ameer-Ul Islam in the brutal rape and murder of a 30-yearold Dalit law student in 2016 — in which the lower court had drawn parallels with the 2012 Nirbhaya case in Delhi. A division Bench of the HC upheld the death penalty, dismissing the appeal filed by the convict challenging the trial court verdict. PTI
