HC scraps OBC tag of several classes

KOLKATA: The Calcutta High Court has struck down the OBC status of several classes in West Bengal, finding such reservations under an Act of 2012 to vacancies in services and posts in the State illegal. It clarified that the services of citizens of the struckdown classes, who are in service, have availed the benefit of reservation or succeeded in any selection process of the State, will not be affected by the order. The threat was received through an email around 3.30 pm by a senior officer posted at the Ministry. It was written in the email that the "building will explode as bomb is planted", police said. PTI

'Terrorists visited India 38-40 times'

AHMEDABAD: The four IS terrorists, who were arrested in Ahmedabad, had visited India 38-40 times at frequent intervals, an official said on Wednesday. Anti-Terrorism Squad Superintendent of Police Sunil Joshi said the accused were found with criminal history, including involvement in drugs smuggling. He further said two of the accused visited India for the first time while the other two visited frequently. ANI

The Election Commission (EC) on Wednesday came down heavily on the ruling BJP and opposition Congress, asking them to desist from campaigning along caste, community, language and religious lines.

NEW DELHI

Noting that the country's socio-cultural milieu cannot be made a casualty of elections, it told BJP president JP Nadda and Congress chief Mallikarjun Kharge that utterances of star campaigners follow patterns and create narratives which can be damaging beyond the Model Code period.

Referring to their respective replies to the notices issued to them on April 25, the election authority said "technical loopholes or extreme interpretations of other political party's utterances" cannot discharge the parties and their campaigners from the core responsibility of their own content, which ought to be corrective to the ongoing discourse "and not further plummeting the quality of

campaign discourse". It reminded the two parties of provisions of the Model Code, which states that no party or candidate will be included in any activity that

may aggravate existing differences or create mutual hatred or cause tension between different castes and communities — religious or

Nadda was issued the notice on opposition charge that Prime Minister Narendra Modi gave a divisive speech in Rajasthan's Banswara. In his reply to the notice, Nadda maintained that the statements of BJP's star campaigners rely on facts to expose the "mal intent" of the Congress to the nation. He had also told the EC that the Congress and the I.N.D.I.A bloc, in pursuance of vote-bank politics, have begun opposing India as a nation, its identity and its original Hindu religion.

The poll watchdog rejected Nadda's defence describing it as "not-tenable" and asked him and his party's star campaigners to desist from campaigning on religious and communal lines. It also asked the BJP to stop campaign speeches that may divide society. "The Commission expects the BJP, as the ruling party at the Centre, to fully align the campaign methods to the practical aspects of the composite and sensitive fabric of India," it said. KTR slams Cong for power cuts in hospital

The Congress government cannot even maintain existing hospitals, let alone build world-class infrastructure. The Chief Minister and



3 countries back **Palestinian State**

Norway, Ireland and Spain said on Wednesday they are recognising a Palestinian State, in a historic but iargely symbolic move that deepens Israel's isolation more than seven months into its grinding war against Hamas in Gaza.

Palestinians welcomed the announcements as an affirmation of their decades-long quest for statehood in east Jerusalem, the West Bank and the Gaza Strip — territories Israel seized in the 1967 Mideast war and still controls.

Israel recalled its ambassadors to the three countries and summoned their

envoys, accusing the Europeans of rewarding the militant Hamas group for its October 7 attack that triggered the war. Netanyahu's government, which is opposed to Palestinian statehood, says the conflict can only be resolved through direct negotiations, which last collapsed over 15 years ago.

The Corporate Affairs Ministry on Wednesday slapped fines on Microsoftowned LinkedIn India, Satya Nadella and eight other individuals for viola tion of the significant beneficial owner norms under the companies law.

In its order, the Registrar (RoC) (NCT of Delhi & Haryana) said LinkedIn India and the individuals violated the Beneficial Owner norms under the Companies Act, 2013. It has slapped penalties totalling Rs 27,10,800 on LinkedIn India, Nadella, LinkedIn CEO Ryan Roslansky and

RBI okays record dividend to Centre

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Wednesday approved the highest-ever dividend payout of Rs 2.11 lakh crore to the Central government for 2023-24, a decision which will help better manage the fiscal deficit.

The dividend or surplus transfer by the RBI to the previous high was Rs 1.76 lakh crore in 2018-19.

The decision on the dividend payout was taken at the 608th meeting of the Central Board of Directors of the RBI held under the chairmanship of Governor Shaktikanta Das. "The Board... approved the trans-

Centre was Rs 87,416 crore for the 2022-23 fiscal. The surplus to the Central government for the accounting year 2023-24," the RBI said in a statement.

The Central government aims to contain the fiscal deficit or gap between expenditure and revenue to Rs 17.34 lakh crore (5.1 per cent of the GDP) during the current financial year. PTI

(IMD) on Wednesday issued a five-day yellow alert with a forecast of thunderstorms accompanied by lightning and gusty winds of 30-40 kmph in multiple districts, including Hyderabad.

Despite the forecast of thundershowers, maximum temperatures are expected to hover between 38 and 40 degrees C till the monthend. Scattered intense storms, lightning and high-

The IMD-Hyderabad officials on Wednesday said relief from heatwave-like conditions is expected after the first week of June when the South West Monsoon will set in. "Relief is expected after the first week of June as summer conditions are likely to gradually subside with the onset of regular rainfall," senior IMD officials said.
