Key BJP allies — TDP chief N Chandrababu Naidu and Bihar Chief Minister and JD(U) supremo Nitish - on Friday en-Kumar dorsed Prime Minister-designate Narendra Modi as the leader of the NDA with a message to balance regional aspirations and national interests.

Speaking at the NDA Parliamentary Party meeting here, BJP allies JD(S) leader HD Kumaraswamy, Shiv Sena chief Eknath Shinde, NCP chief Ajit Pawar and HAM(S) chief Jitan Ram Manjhi, among others, supported the proposal moved by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh to elect Modi as

the leader of the NDA. Modi said he would strive to ensure unanimity in running the next government and asserted that the NDA is not a combine of some parties to get power but an organic alliance committed to the principle of 'nation first'.

Chosen by the BJP-led NDA as its leader to become Prime Minister for the third time, Modi said the ruling combine is committed to the constitutional principle of 'sarva panth sambhava (interfaith har-

Murmu appointed him as the Prime Ministerdesignate after BJP chief JP Nadda handed her a letter on Modi's election as the leader of the BJP Parliamentary Party and NDA leaders submitted their letters of support. The President will administer the oath of office and secrecy at 7.15 pm on Sunday at Rashtrapati Bhavan. (RELATED REPORTS PAGE 5)

JD(U) EYES RAILWAY MINISTRY, SPECIAL STATUS FOR BIHAR

NEW DELHI: Prior to the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) meeting on Friday, JD(U) MPs, led by Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, held a meeting in the national capital, dur ing which the party reiterated its full support for the government led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi at the Centre. The JD(U)'s meeting was significant as key issues such as government formation and the Cen-tral Cabinet were discussed. Former MP Anand Mohan, MP Lalan Singh and other senior JD(U) leaders were present at the deliberations. Before the meeting, the JD(U)

MPs reiterated their demand for the Ministry of Railways as Nitish Kumar was the Railway Minister in the Atal Bihari Vajpayee government. How-ever, the JD(U) has not issued any official statements regarding Cabi-

net positions and portfolios as yet. MP Lalan Singh, known to be close to Nitish Kumar, mentioned that the structure of the Cabinet was the prerogative of the Prime Minister Meanwhile, some MPs also demanded Special Category Status for Bihar during the meeting. While many JD(U) MPs arrived in Delhi on Thursday, Nitish Kumar has been in Delhi since June 5 for the NDA meet-ing. Notably, various statements from JD(U) leaders have emerged during this period. Party spokesper son, KC Tyagi reiterated the demand for Special Category Status for Bihar and commented on the Agnipath scheme, noting that a section of vot-

ers was unhappy with it. Regarding the Uniform Civil Code, he stated that as national president of the party, the Chief Minister had written to the Law Commis sion, emphasising that all stakehold ers should be consulted for a solution. JANS

Freeze on funds leaves local bodies in lurch

Gram panchayats across Telangana are grappling with severe financial difficulties due to the non-release of funds by the State government for the past six months.

This funding freeze has left many village administrations struggling to manage basic services and operations. Of the nearly Rs 1,380 crore pending for payment to the gram panchayats, the State government is learnt to have released only Rs 160 crore in two spells

over the last six months. During the previous BRS regime, around Rs 230 crore was released every month to 12,769 gram panchayats across the State. The State government released matching grants along with Central funds. These funds supported various rural development initiatives, including garbage collection, road maintenance and the operations of dumpyards. The previous govern-

ment also appointed a Panchayat Secretary for each village under the new Panchayat Raj Act, which aimed to make gram pan-

chayats a model for the country. Due to these initiatives, the rural local bodies of Telangana won numerous awards from the Centre under various categories/ schemes over the last threefour years.

However, the current government has significantly cut these monthly allocations. Panchayat officials are under pressure to cover emergency expenses from their own pockets, adding to their financial strain. The situation has worsened with the expiry of the rural local bodies' term in February this year, following which the administration is being handled by the special officers ap-pointed by the State government. The situation is especially dire for smaller gram panchayats, where the lack of funds has halted essential services. (SEE PAGE 2)

over 23 lakh students from across the country this year, has run into rough weather. MBBS aspirants, parents, edu-influencers and training institutions have raised concerns over the way the ranks were issued, with some even demanding that the prestigious examination

be re-conducted. This year, the National Testing Agency (NTA), which conducts NEET, released the results of NEET-2024 medical entrance test on Tuesday (June 4).

Within 24 hours, students and parents started reporting major discrepancies over the way the marks, results and ranks were finalised.

For the first time, record 66 candidates secured first rank, i.e. they scored the maximum of 720 marks, in NEET-2024. Rather

results for the past several years have said every year, there are three to four toppers and the probability of 66 candidates securing 100 per cent marks in just one year is highly unlikely.

"The NEET-2024 examination was not easy and it is impossible that a total of 66 students at one go will be able to secure the first rank by scoring 100 per cent marks. There is a definite error in the marking system, which has to be clarified by the NTA so that a clear pic-ture emerges," Alakh Pandey, CEO of edu-tech

company Physics Wallah, was quoted as saying by multiple media platforms. A large number of medical aspirants from across the country have also com-

plained that certain candidates scored marks that are mathematically impossible. (SEE PAGE 2)
