Defections masterminded by Chief Minister and Telangana Pradesh Congress Committee (TPCC) president A Revanth Reddy along with what several leaders see as his autocratic way of functioning, has thrown the Congress into turmoil in the State.

Over the last few days, defections engineered by Revanth Reddy of senior BRS leaders into the party stoked the fire that was already raging over other issues, including candidates for nominated posts and the Cabinet expansion, which have been dragging on. On Monday, even as Revanth Reddy flew to New Delhi to participate

the BRS into the Congress saw multiple leaders coming out against the move.

Congress MLC T Jeevan Reddy, who was twice de-feated by Sanjay Kumar in Assembly polls, was at the forefront, holding meetings with his supporters and reportedly contemplating quitting the party, complaining that he was not consulted about the move.

Congress Kisan Cell State coordinator Vakati Satyam Reddy resigned from his post on Monday, registering his protest against Sanjay's entry. Jeevan Reddy had already spoken out against defections being encouraged after Revanth Reddy visited Banswada MLA Pocharam Srinivas and got him to join Congress. (SEE PAGES 2.5)
