There will be no demolition of properties, including of those accused of crime till October 1 without its permission, the Supreme Court said on Tuesday while observing that even one instance of illegal demolition was against the "ethos" of the Constitution.

A Bench of Justices BR Gavai and KV Viswanathan clarified that its order will not be applicable to unauthorised structures on public roads, footpaths, rails lines or public places such as water bodies etc.

"Stand over to October 1 at the request of the Solicitor General. However, we direct that till the next date, no demolition without seeking leave of this court," the Bench said. "Even if there is one instance of an illegal demolition... it is against the ethos of our Constitution," the top court observed while hearing pleas that alleged that the properties of the accused were being demolished in

statements made after the September 2 hearing in the matter during which the apex court had said it proposes to lay down certain guidelines on the issue that would be enforceable across the country.
"After that order, there

have been statements that the bulldozer will continue ... and it all depends in whose hands the steering is," the Bench said, adding it was refraining from saying anything further on that. "Mr Mehta (solicitor gen-

# Atishi next Delhi CM, Kejriwal resigns

The Aam Aadmi Party led by its Chief Minister-designate Atishi staked claim to form a new government in Delhi on Tuesday shortly after Arvind Kejriwal resigned from the post, an effort seen as a bold gambit to seize the initiative ahead of Assembly elections due in five months. "I will work with one goal for the next few months... to bring back Kejriwal as the Chief Minister," said the 43-year-old who is set to be Delhi's third woman Chief Minister after Congress' Sheila Dikshit

and BJP's Sushma Swaraj. It was confirmation if any were needed that Kejriwal's grip on the party remains firm and this move is aimed at giving him space to set the agenda. Beset by charges of corruption over the excise scam and released from jail last week, the AAP supremo submitted his resignation to Lt Governor VK Saxena in the evening, virtually seeking a referendum on his "politics of honesty".

The new Chief Minister will prove the majority of her government in the Delhi Assembly, a session of which

has been called by the ruling AAP dispensation on September 26-27.

Atishi, who holds 14 portfolios, including Finance, Education and Revenue, was amongst those holding the fort while Kejriwal was in jail. "We have staked claim to form a new government. I will protect the interests of Delhi people," she said after Kejriwal's meeting with the LG.

## Announcement on census soon: Shah

"We will announce it very soon," Shah said in response to a question on conducting the decadal census of the Indian population which has been delayed due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Shah, along with I&B Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw, was addressing a press conference to mark the 100 days of the third tenure of the NDA government led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. "We will make all the details public when we announce the census," the Union Home Minister said to questions on the caste

### **Vociferous demands** India has conducted the

census every 10 years since 1881. The first phase of this decade's census was expected to begin on April 1, 2020, but had to be post-

pandemic. Shah's comments on the census come amid vociferous demands from political parties to conduct a caste census. In the absence of fresh data, government agencies are still formulating policies allocating subsidies based on the data of the 2011 census.
