Rs 5 meal scheme in govt hospitals diluted



In 2022, the then BRS government launched the initiative in all major tertiary hospitals in Hyderabad.

The coverage of the Rs 5 per meal scheme to attendants of patients at government hospitals in Hyderabad has gradually shrunk in the last eight to nine months. Earlier, the initiative covered anywhere between 18,000 and 20,000 attendants per day. However, the number has now gradually come down to 4,000 to 5,000 patient attendants per day.

One should not transgress limits, SC on CM's remarks

NEW DELHI

It is expected that all three wings of the Constitution show mutual respect for each other's functioning as "unwarranted comments" bring friction unnecessarily, the Supreme Court said.

Observing that a fair criticism of judgments is always welcome but one should not "transgress the limits", a Bench of Justices BR Gavai and KV Viswanathan said one should be careful enough while making comments about orders passed by courts. DON'T INTERFERE, APEX COURT TO **REVANTH IN CASH-FOR-VOTE CASE**

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court directed Telangana Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy not to interfere in anyway with the functioning of prosecution in the proceedings of the 2015 cash-for-vote case, in which he is one of the accused. While refusing to transfer the trial in the case from Telangana to Bhopal, the Bench said the director general of ACB would not report to the Chief Minister regarding the prosecution of the case. The apex court passed the order while hearing a plea filed by BRS MLA Guntakandla Jagadish Reddy and three others who had sought a transfer of trial in the case from Telangana to Bhopal.
