The Education Department will embark on a comprehensive revision of school textbooks, aligning them with the National Curriculum Framework (NCF) 2023, released by the Central government.

This significant update, the first since 2015, is set to be taken up shortly by the State Council of Educational Research and Training (SCERT), a wing of the School Education Department.

The revision will be carried out in a phased manner starting with non-languages - Mathematics, Sciences, and Social Sciences fol-

lowed by languages Telugu, Hindi, Urdu and English.

For this, subject-wise expert committees, comprising senior professors and teachers will be constituted

by the SCERT. After a series of consultations with the

preparatory, middle and secondary — the NCF 2023 focuses on holistic development, equity and inclusion, curriculum flexibility, integration of technology and environmental consciousness among other areas.

#### Multidisciplinary learning

It emphasises competencybased education, multidisciplinary learning, continuous assessment, local context and culture, and teacher empowerment, among other areas. As per the new framework, social science will have 20 per cent content at the local level, 30 per cent at regional level, 30 per cent at national level and 20 per cent at the international level (SEE PAGE 2)
