BUDAPEST: India scripted history in the Chess Olympiad as its men's and women's teams clinched their maiden titles in a rare clean sweep of gold medals after beating their respective opponents in the final round. The men's team defeated Slovenia 3.5-0.5 while their women counterparts crushed Azerbaijan with an identical margin in the 11th and final round in the Chess Olympiad.

# **Uncertainty continues** over Rythu Bharosa

## Congress-led government yet to deliver on its promise

Farmers in Telangana are grappling with uncertainty as the Congress-led government continues to delay the promised financial support under the Rythu Bharosa scheme.

The Congress, which pledged Rs 15,000 per acre per annum as farm investment support if it came to power, is yet to deliver on its promise. Many farmers, already frustrated by incomplete loan waivers, are sceptical about whether the Rythu Bharosa funds will materialise in the absence of guidelines for its implemen-

Though the State government appointed a three-member Cabinet sub-committee to look into the issues and submit a report, none is aware of its fate. The Cabinet sub-committee held around four to five consultations with some stakeholders, including farmers, during July-August, but the report neither reached the State Cabinet for approval nor was discussed in the Assembly as promised for its

## 'Selfie for loan waiver' launched in Dubbak

**SIDDIPET:** Farmers in the district launched a 'selfie for loan waiver' campaign in the Dubbak constituency on Sunday. The campaign is expected to spread all over the district starting Monday as it was drawing a great response from farmers.

gest that the State government might disburse Rythu Bharosa amount for the two crop seasons of Vanakalam and Yasangi by Dasara, raising hopes for timely support. However, there has been no official announce-

ment in this regard, indicating no immediate relief. "If not two, at least one crop payment should be released to help farmers to aid the upcoming Yasangi sowing period. Many farmers struggled due to lack of support in July for this Vanakalam season," farmers appealed. However, concerns remain over the scheme's implementation guidelines, particularly for large farmers. There are fears that only those with less than 10 acres may be eligible, leaving larger landholders without support. Additionally, government employees might

With regard to the tenant farmers, who were also promised Rs 15,000 per acre per annum, Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao already indicated that both the land owner and tenant farmer should reach an understanding in this regard. For the amount to be credited into the tenant farmer's account, the State government is likely to ask them to submit their lease agreement in this regard, raising curtains for more complexities. # 'Quad not against anyone, it will stay'

## Modi says free, prosperous Indo-Pacific priority

WILMINGTON

Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that the Quad is not against anyone, but for a rules-based international order and respect for sovereignty, in a veiled reference to China. "Free, open, inclusive and prosperous Indo-Pacific is our priority," Modi said in his opening remarks at the summit hosted by President Joe Biden and also attended by Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese and Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida.

"We are not against anyone. We all support a rulesbased international order, respect for sovereignty, territorial integrity, and peaceful resolution of all issues," Modi said, without naming any country. China is engaged in hotly contested territorial disputes in both the South China Sea and the East China Sea. China claims sovereignty over all of the South China Sea.

Vietnam, Malaysia, the Philippines, Brunei and Taiwan have counterclaims. "Our message is clear – Quad is here to stay, to assist, to partner and to complement," Modi said. "Together we have taken many positive and inclusive initia-

WASHINGTON: US President Joe Biden was caught on a hot mic telling leaders of Quad nations that China was testing them, thus reflecting upon the American seriousness of the emerging Chinese threat. Biden's remark came during the Quad Leaders' Summit, which was attended by PM Narendra Modi, Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese and Japanese PM Fumio Kishida. "We believe Xi Jinping is looking to focus on domestic economic challenges and minimise the turbulence in China," Biden told the leaders at the Summit. PTI

HYDRAA's 'selective' act draws ire

The Hyderabad Disaster Response and Assets Protection Agency's (HYDRAA) demolition spree on Sunday triggered criticism from different sections over its selective targets, leaving no options for the owners to seek legal help. Many questioned the

State government and HY-DRAA, in particular, over its discriminative approach towards the poor and middle income groups while providing sufficient time for high-income groups and persons close to the powers that be.

Emotional scenes unfolded at Nalla Cheruvu, Kukatpally, Kistareddypet and Patelguda of Ameenpur mandal on Sunday when HYDRAA demolished a few structures. Sharing a video of a woman crying inconsolably at a demolition site AdityaWarangal, "Chief Minister saab people do small business by raising loans. Imagine the hardwork, if a family invests Rs 50 lakh in catering stall. It is unfortunate that they were not even given time to collect their belongings."

Many compared this to the long rope being extended to others, especially Chief Minister A Revanth

Reddy's brother A Tirupathi Reddy, who was served a notice more than a month ago citing his house was in the FTL of Durgam Cheruvu. The Revenue Department served notices to house owners in the Amar Cooperative Society, Kavuri Hills, Kalyan Nagar and other areas on August 8 stating that their structures were in FTL and the buffer zone of Durgam Cheruvu.

# AP forms SIT to probe laddu row

Hitting out at the previous YSRCP government, Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu on Sunday alleged that several procedures to procure ghee at Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD) were altered during the earlier regime, prompting him to form a special investigation team (SIT) to probe the irregularities. He also alleged that appointments to the

TTD board became like "gambling" during the previous government and there were instances of appointing people who had no faith and giving preferences to non-Hindus on the board.
