HYDERABAD A day after the victims of the Musi Riverfront Development Project approached BRS at Telangana Bhavan for help, elected representatives of the party, led by for-mer Minister and BRS MLA

T Harish Rao, visited the affected areas on Sunday. They interacted with the families and listened to their woes, assuring them that the BRS would stand by them throughout their struggle. Initially, the police stalled the BRS legislators from leaving Telangana Bhavan where the latter gathered before heading to the affected areas, citing law and

order issues.

However, the BRS elected representatives assured the cops that there would not be such issue and said they were accompanied by the local MLAs, who were entitled to meet their constituents. The legislators then proceeded to visit the affected areas of Hydershahkote, Sun City, Langer Houz and surrounding areas, to listen to the challenges faced by the locals, especially those facing the threat of losing their homes.

They also joined the ongoing protests staged by residents of Hydershahkote, inwomen and cluding children, against demolition of their homes.

The MLAs reassured the public that the BRS would stand by the victims to safeguard their hard-earned properties. They said it was the previous Congress and

HYDERABAD: Tension prevailed at the Chanchalguda Double Bedroom Society located on Saidabad road on Saturday night following a clash between the Musi project-affected families and 2BHK housing scheme aspirants. The issue began after the revenue authorities issued allotment letters to families staying in the Musi river FTL and buffer zone, and asked them to move to the Double Bedroom Society at Saidabad.

the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) governments that approved these layouts and gave permissions for the construction of houses, besides collecting all types of taxes and charges over several decades. Addressing the public during the visit, Harish Rao criticised the State government's Musi Riverfront Development project, charging Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy with displacing thousands of poor families in the name of development. He questioned the misplaced priorities of the State government jeopardising the lives of citizens to make way for corporate companies. Revanth Reddy was act-

ing like a real estate businessman, evicting the poor in the name of beautification. Thousands were being made homeless and the victims were being terrorised, he said, demanding that the Chief Minister address the

affected families and halt the project. "Revanth Reddy should announce the withdrawal of the project immediately. The government should be with the people, not against them. Another top Hezbollah official killed

Nabil Kaouk was deputy head of outfit's Central Council

JERUSALEM

The Israeli military said on Sunday that it killed another high-ranking Hezbollah official in an airstrike as the Lebanese militant group was reeling from a string of devastating blows and the killing of its overall leader, Hassan Nasrallah.

The military said Nabil Kaouk, the deputy head of Hezbollah's Central Council, was killed on Saturday. Hezbollah confirmed the death of Kaouk hours after an Israeli airstrike on northeast Lebanon killed 11 people. He is the seventh senior Hezbollah leader slain in Israeli strikes in a little over a week, including founding members who had evaded death or detention for decades. The outfit also confirmed that one of its seven leaders, Ali Karaki, died in Friday's strike that killed Nasrallah. The Israeli military had earlier said

Karaki was killed in the airstrike that targeted an underground compound in Beirut where Nasrallah and other senior Hezbollah fig-

ures were meeting. Meanwhile, at least 24 people were killed in Israeli airstrikes that hit two adjacent buildings east of the southern city of Sidon, the Lebanese Health Ministry said. The Ministry said the strikes also injured at least 29 people. AP (NOW, KHAMENEI ON BIBI'S RADAR? PAGE 9)

Metro to connect airport with Fourth City

The Metro Rail has been planned to be extended, covering 40 km, from the airport at Shamshabad to the proposed Fourth City via Mansanpally and ORR between the exits at Pedda Golconda and Raviryal.

Centre mulls 3 Bills for ONOE

The Centre is likely to bring three Bills, including two to amend the Constitution, to put in place its plan to hold simultaneous elections.

One of the proposed Constitution amendment Bills, which deals with aligning the local bodies elections to that of the Lok Sabha and the Assemblies, will require an endorsement from at least 50 per cent of the States. Moving ahead with its 'one nation, one election' (ONOE) plan, the Centre earlier this month accepted the recommendations of the high-level committee for holding simultaneous polls for the Lok Sabha, State Assemblies and local bodies in a phased manner after a



countrywide consensus-

building exercise. The proposed first constitutional amendment Bill would deal with making provisions for holding Lok Sabha and Assembly elections together. Citing recommendations of the highlevel committee, sources

said the proposed Bill would seek to amend Article 82A by adding sub-clause (1) relating to the 'appointed date'. It will also seek to insert sub-clause (2) to Article 82A relating to the end of terms of the Lok Sabha and State Legislative Assemblies together. It also proposes to

amend Article 83(2) and insert new sub-clauses (3) and (4) relating to the duration and dissolution of the Lok Sabha. It has provisions related to the dissolution of Assemblies and amending Article 327 to insert the term 'simultaneous elections'. This Bill will not require ratification by at least 50 per cent of the States, the recommendation said.

The proposed second Constitutional amendment Bill will require ratification by at least 50 per cent of the Assemblies as it will deal with matters relating to State affairs. It will seek to amend provisions relating to the preparation of electoral rolls by the EC in consultation with SECs for elections to local bodies. PTI
