TG economic engine comes to grinding halt

Under Cong. State now finds itself in precarious financial slope

After nearly a decade of remarkable progress, Telangana's economic engine has begun to sputter. Once a beacon economic of progress and fiscal prudence, the State now finds itself in a precarious financial slope under the Congressled government, with alarming trends emerging in just 11 months of A Revanth Reddy's administration.

From 2014-15 to 2023-24, Telangana stood as a testament to effective governance and economic management. Tax revenues surged from Rs 37,477 crore to an impressive Rs 1.35 lakh crore, while the State's Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) at current prices rose to Rs 14.64 lakh crore an 11.9 per cent increase, marking the third largest increase in the country. Telangana secured a spot among the top three States with the highest GSDP growth rate for the past three years.

In 2023-24, the State ranked second in per capita income among large States,

In the current financial year, Telangana has managed to meet only 39.41 per cent of its revenue target, collecting Rs 1.08 lakh crore of the projected Rs 2.74 lakh crore. Tax revenue collections have also faltered, with just 41.91 per cent of the annual target realised. Debt has bal-

In the last 11 months, the Revanth Reddy government added Rs 77,118 crore to the State's debt — surpassing the Rs 72,658 crore accumulated over 58 years of united Andhra Pradesh. The Congress government has guaranteed loans worth Rs 25,000 crore to corporations within eight months, adding to its financial woes. This translates to a per capita debt of Rs 19,279, a burden borne by each citizen.

Critics argue that this borrowing spree has not translated into visible development. The capital expenditure for infrastructure development and asset creation shot up from Rs 8,373 crore to Rs 44,252 crore in 2023-24. The previous BRS government spent 18 per cent more than the annual target of capital expenditure during the previous fiscal.

Manipur on boil, NPP pulls out of BJP govt

Party blames Biren for failing to resolve crisis: houses of four more MLAs torched

The National People's Party (NPP) on Sunday withdrew support from the BJP-led government in Manipur, even as violence continued to rock the State as offices of the Congress and the saffron party were ransacked in the hill district of Jiribam where an unidentified body was found earlier in the day, officials said.

A BJP MLA's ancestral house was vandalised in Imphal Valley while a building owned by Ashab Uddin, the Independent legislator of Jiribam, was ransacked, officials said. The incidents occurred a day after irate mobs set fire to the residences of three BJP legislators, one of whom is a senior minister, and a Congress MLA in various districts of Imphal Valley where an indefinite curfew has been clamped. Security forces also foiled the attempt of the

Why silent on land acquisition in TG, KTR asks Rahul

BRS working president KT Rama Rao questioned Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's silence on forcible land acquisition and corporate influence in Telangana while claiming to fight them in other States. He slammed the Congress leader for double standards. "Rahul Gandhi ji, what is

the point of raising your voice against land acquisition and attacking Adani-Ambani when you have failed to stop land acquisition in Telangana?" he asked. Rama Rao rubbished Rahul Gandhi's claims of standing up for farmers, pointing out that the Congress has been exploiting Telangana's people for generations.

"Your fight against Adani-Ambani is just for show," he remarked. Taking to X on Sunday, Rama Rao also criticised the Congress government in the State for allowing Adani Group to open its cement factory at Ramanet, while farmers in Ko dangal continue to suffer.

"Is this a case of 'I act like hitting, you act like crying'? Is there a secret pact behind this drama?" he questioned, raising doubts about possible business links between Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy and businessman Gautam Adani. He also went on to

counter Rahul Gandhi's false promise to provide financial assistance of Rs 3,000 per month to women under Mahalakshmi Yojana during the Assembly election campaign in Maharashtra. He charged Rahul Gandhi with cheating women in Telangana, promising them with a guarantee of Rs 2,500 per month within 100 days of the Congress assuming power. "It's nearly 350 days now. 1.67 crore women in Telangana are still waiting for your promise to be fulfilled which am sure will not happen. Aren't you and your party tired of this rhetoric of deceit?" (sic) he asked.

The deceased, who apparently fell unconscious after being made to stand for a long time, was a first-year MBBS student at the college. The victim, Anil Methaniya, fell unconscious and died allegedly after being made to stand for three hours during ragging by his seniors at a hostel of GMERS Medical College and Hospital at Dharpur in Patan on Saturday night, the college dean, Dr Hardik Shah, said. Onion prices touch Rs 80/kg in Hyd

Onions are back to bring tears to the eyes of consumers with their prices. The prices have again hit the roof, with a kilogram of the edible bulb sold at Rs 80 in retail markets across the city. The prices, which until a week ago, hovered anywhere between Rs 30 and Rs 40 a kg, have almost doubled, leading to reduced sales and even consumption to a certain extent.

Traders in the wholesale market attribute the price rise to low supplies from local regions of Telangana, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh and Maharashtra. A majority

of the onion is sourced from Maharashtra and Karnataka. B Satyanarayana, a whole-

sale trader at Mahabubgunj Market at Malakpet, said the supplies were affected by

the low crop yield in Karnataka and Maharashtra due to heavy rains. "There was huge crop damage, and the farmers suffered losses. To make up the loss, the farmers

Mahabubgunj, Osmangunj, Bowenpally and Gudimalkapur. "Daily, around 250 truck load of onion arrives in the city from different parts of country. Currently, only 150 truckloads of onions are coming," said Bandla Satish, a trader at Osmangunj market. At Rythu Bazaar, the onion is sold for Rs 65 a kg. However, traders point out that onion is usually classified into grades and at Rythu Bazaar, the Grade-2 onions are sold by middlemen.
