'Congress resorting to cultural vandalism'

KTR slams govt over Telangana Thalli statue, calls for protests

BRS working President KT Rama Rao on Monday condemned the Congress government for indulging in cultural vandalism by altering the design of the Telangana Thalli statue, charging it with attempting to erase the cultural and historical identity of the State. He called for Statewide peaceful protests to highlight the issue. "I appeal to BRS cadres to

perform Palabhishekam and Panchamrita Abhishekam to cleanse statues of Telangana Thalli existing across the State on Tuesday, as reparation for the sin committed by the Congress and to seek her forgiveness. I also request the party workers and Telangana citizens to change their social media profile pictures to images of the original Telangana Thalli in solidarity," he appealed.

Rama Rao inaugurated the BRS Medchal district office and unveiled the Telangana Thalli statue at the party office on Monday, marking the Deeksha Vijay Diwas to commemorate the announcement of the formaact of political vendetta, dis-

Soros, Adani issues rock Parliament NEW DELHI

Opposition's protests over allegations of George Soros-Congress link and Adani issue rocked both Houses of Parliament on Monday leading to adjournment of proceedings without transacting any significant business.

In Lok Sabha, opposition members submitted notices to move a privilege motion against a BJP member for remarks targeting Leader of the Opposition Rahul Gandhi. This led to repeated adjournments till 3 pm before the proceedings were called off for the day. Opposition members raised slogans like "Modi down Sarkar down", Sarkar "Modi shame shame" and "we want justice", as BJP member Sandhya Ray, who was in the chair, took up tabling of

parliamentary papers. Rajya Sabha proceedings were also disrupted several times as the treasury benches accused top Congress leaders of col-luding with billionaire investor George Soros to destabilise the country, triggering protests from opposition members. Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar held a meeting with leaders of both sides and said its purpose was to ensure that the House runs smoothly. PTI
