Ghee row hits Bhadradri temple

A controversy is brewing over ghee procurement at the Sri Seetha Ramachandra Swamy Devasthanam at Bhadrachalam, with the top temple official facing disciplinary action.

The episode began when the temple's Executive Officer (EO) L Rama Devi allegedly signed an agreement with a private firm, Rythu Dairy of Jangareddygudem in Andhra Pradesh, for the procurement of ghee to prepare laddu prasadam at the temple. The temple was earlier procuring ghee from the Karimnagar Dairy and the EO's act, according to officials, was against the rules. The State government had in August issued orders

directing all endowment temples to procure ghee from the governmentowned Vijaya Dairy. But, the EO signed the agreement with the private dairy, which quoted a lesser price in the tender but did not meet the requisite conditions, official sources said.

Endowments Minister Konda Surekha was said to have expressed anger at the EO for ignoring the government orders. She reportedly directed Endowments Department Principal Secretary Shailaja Ramaiyer on Tuesday to transfer the EO to the Revenue Department, from which she was on deputation in the Endowments Department. Surekha also directed the official to cancel the ghee tender and issue a charge memo to the EO. (SEE PAGE 2)
