NEW DELHI Former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh, the architect of India's economic reforms, died here on Thurs-

day night. He was 92. Singh's death was an-nounced by the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Delhi, where he was admitted in the Emergency ward around 8.30 pm in a critical condition. An AIIMS bulletin said "he was treated for age-related medical conditions and had sudden loss of consciousness at home" on December 26.

"Resuscitative measures were started immediately at home. He was brought to the medical emergency at AIIMS Delhi at 8.06 pm. Despite all efforts, he could not be revived and was declared



Singh, who was Prime Minister for two terms in the Congress-led UPA government from 2004 to 2014, had been in poor health for the last few months. He is survived by wife Gurcharan Minister under the then Prime Minister PV Narasimha Rao, was the architect and brainchild of economic reforms in 1991 that pulled India from the brink of bankruptcy.

Paying tributes to his predecessor, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said India mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished leaders whose wisdom and humility were always visible.

Rising from humble origins, he rose to become a respected economist, Modi said, "His interventions in Parliament were also insightful. As our Prime Minister, he made extensive efforts to improve people's lives." "His wisdom and humility were always visible." Modi said.
