

The Congress government in Telangana is setting alarmingly poor records in fiscal mismanagement with its decision to borrow an unprecedented Rs 30,000 crore in the last quarter of the current financial year (2024-25).

This massive borrowing spree is likely to not only shatter the State's budgetary estimates, but also push its debt burden perilously close to the liabilities Telangana inherited at its formation in 2014. The government's calendar for borrowing indicates plans to participate in auctions on all 12 Tuesdays of the January-March quar-ter, raising Rs 10,000 crore each month.

This level of dependency on market loans showcases a lack of foresight and governance, financial experts opined.

The planned borrowing would propel the State's market debt to Rs 70,757 crore for the year, almost equivalent to the Rs 72,658

Under the Fiscal Respon-sibility and Budget Management (FRBM) Act, States are permitted to borrow up to 3.5 per cent of their Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP). Telangana's GSDP for 2024-25 was pegged at around Rs 16 lakh crore, allowing a borrowing ceiling of Rs 57,112 crore. However, the Centre re-

stricted it to Rs 49,255 crore due to budgetary adjustments made during the Covid-19 period to maintain FRBM norms. But, the Con-

gress government has already borrowed Rs.40,757 crore by December-end. The additional Rs 30,000 crore borrowing plan would overshoot the Budget estimates by a staggering Rs 21,502 crore. Experts have criticised the government's move as a blatant disregard for fiscal discipline as it is higher even by standard

FRBM limits. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has clarified that the actual amount of borrowing depends on approval from the union Finance Ministry under Article 293(3) of the Constitution. Yet, the State Finance Department remains tightlipped on whether the Cenhas cleared this tre exorbitant borrowing proposal over and above the ceiling fixed for the current fiscal. Economists point out that the Congress govern-ment's borrowing spree is not matched by visible improvements in infrastructure or public services. Instead, these funds appear to be fuelling poorly-planned populist schemes and temporary measures that do little to generate long-term economic growth.

Leakage at Srisailam power house triggers concerns

HYDERABAD: Srisailam Left Bank power house, a crucial component of Telangana's energy infrastructure, faced an unexpected crisis. Over the past few days, a minor leakage was detected in the cooling system, causing concern among engineers and staff. The leakage, originating from a small crack in one of the draft tubes, had led to water seeping out and pooling around the turbine. This was dismissed initially as just a minor inconvenience; but it posed a serious threat to the operations of the plant. The continuous flow of water around the turbine could lead to corrosion and operational issues, if not addressed soon. (SEE PAGE 2)

NSP faces structural issues due to potholes on spillway

HYDERABAD: After experiencing two years of poor inflows, the Nagarjuna Sagar Project is now facing the issues that come with abundant water flows. For the last six months, the project has been continuously releasing floodwaters after retaining as much as possible to maintain its gross storage levels. This has had a considerable impact on the spillways. A pressing issue before the project authorities is the appearance of potholes on the project spillway. These potholes, ranging from 1-6 meters deep, could pose a risk to the structural integrity of the dam. If not addressed promptly and properly, these could lead to further deterioration (REPORT PAGE 5)

Cold wave-like conditions grip State

A fresh spell of cold wavelike conditions, after a break of nearly 15-days, has gripped Hyderabad and parts of Telangana, causing a steep drop in minimum temperatures and extensive fogging in the early hours of Thursday.

With the pattern of weather shifting, the Indian Meteorological Department (IMD)-Hvderabad on Thursday evening, in its updated forecast, said the minimum temperatures will hover between 2 degrees C and 3 degrees C in a few isolated districts of Telangana, in addition to mist or hazy conditions in the morning over the next five days.

After December 17, 2024, when the minimum temperatures at several locations in Telangana and Hyderabad dropped to single digits, temperatures started to rise

and hover between 17 degrees C and 19 degrees C due to excessive cloud cover. However, with weather remaining largely dry, there has been a resurgence of cold-wave like conditions in Telangana with the start of the New Year.

On Thursday, in Hyderabad, the University of Hyderabad (UoH) campus in

Gachibowli recorded the lowest at 11 degrees C, while Sirpur in Kumram Bheem Asifabad district recorded 7.3 degrees C, the lowest in the State.

As temperatures dropped considerably, a layer of thick fog shrouded several places, especially the outskirts in Hyderabad, including Kompally, Patancheru, LB Nagar

and Vanasthalipuram, on Thursday. Based on the weather data from the Telangana State Development Planning Society (TSDPS), the minimum temperatures in multiple regions of Hyderabad, which used to hover between 15 degrees C and 19 degrees C till the last few days, has now dropped to less than 15 degrees C. At Moula Ali, the minimum temperature dropped to 12.1 degrees C, Rajendranagar while recorded a minimum of 12.3 degrees C.

Single digit minimum temperatures ranged from 7.3 degrees to 9.9 degrees in Kumram Bheem Asifabad, Sangareddy and Adilabad districts. Another mandal in Kumram Bheem Asifabad, Tirvani, recorded a minimum of 8 degrees, while Kohir in Sangareddy district recorded a minimum of 8.4 degrees C.

Protests over hidden cams in engg college

Allegations of girl students being surreptitiously filmed using hidden mobile cameras in a washroom of an engineering college on the city outskirts resulted in massive protests on the college campus.

The impromptu protests on Wednesday night snowballed with other students and students unions lending support and joining the aggrieved girl students on the campus on Thursday.

The students allege that around 300 private videos were secretly recorded in the girls' washroom over the last three months but the college management kept the issue under wraps. Expressing suspicions of some hostel workers being involved in recording the videos, the students claim

that the management had threatened them with severe consequences if the issue went out.

The secret filming in the washroom came to light on New Year's Eve when a girl student, who went to use the washroom after attending a musical night, found a mobile camera in the ventilator. According to a complaint registered with the Medchal police, the student informed the warden about the hidden mobile, but the warden allegedly did not respond immediately and take

any action. The complaint also alleged that evidence was removed from the scene and there was neither proper management nor supervision of the hostels. Men were roaming the hostel premises at night and there was no proper security, the student said. (SEE PAGE 2)
