# Congress at it again! Slashes Rythu Bharosa to Rs 12,000

#### Citing financial woes, Revanth goes back on hiking aid to Rs 15,000

The Congress government, which came to power riding high on its promise of hiking the Rythu Bharosa financial assistance for farmers from Rs 10,000 to Rs 15,000 per acre, has once again revealed its deceptive side by limiting the hike to just Rs 12,000 annum.

Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy, who said the financial assistance would be released from January 26, blamed the current financial condition of the State for his inability to keep his prom-

Addressing the media after a Cabinet meeting here on Saturday, Revanth Reddy said the government was "forced" by the financial condition of the State to reduce the Rythu Bharosa amount.

#### **FARMERS BETRAYED, SAYS HARISH**

**HYDERABAD:** Coming down heavily on the Congress government in the State for backing out on its guarantees, BRS leader and former Minister T Harish Rao accused the Congress government of betraying Telangana's farmers with false promises. The Congress party, which came to power on the back of grand promises to increase investment support under Rythu Bandhu and provide Rs 15,000 per acre annually through its "Rythu Bharosa" scheme, has failed to deliver on its commitments. Reacting to the cabinet decision to give only Rs.6000 per acre per sea son, he recalled that during the election campaigns, Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy had confidently proclaimed, "BRS is giving Rs 10,000 now; vote for us, and we will provide Rs 15,000." However, after securing power, the Congress government haD reduced the Rythu Bharosa scheme to just Rs.6,000 per acre per season, far below the Rs.7,500 per season they had assured. This has led to widespread disappointment among farmers, who feel betrayed by the government's inability

## Gruha Jyothi scheme flickers

Even as the State government is making tall claims about providing free power of up to 200 units under the Gruĥa Jyothi Scheme, lakhs of consumers across Telangana are in a fix as they have

been deprived of the benefit. The beneficiaries claim that several eligible people

were left out in the first phase of the Gruha Jyothi Scheme and the government has asked them to reapply. However, since then a large number of people are not receiving zero bills. Sources say in the districts of Hyderabad, Ran-

gareddy and Med-chal, a total of 19.8 lakh applications were submitted under the Gruha Jyoti Scheme as part of the Praja Palana programme. However, around 2.50 lakh eligible applicants are still receiving electricity bills, with no benefit being ex-

tended to them. A similar situation is prevailing in all the districts of the State. Officials have attributed this issue to incomplete data entry, which is preventing eligible consumers from receiving the promised zero

As per official data, there are over 1,31,48,000 household electricity connections in the State, of which 1.05

crore households consume 200 units per month. ## No HMPV cases in State so far

So far no case of Human Metapneumovirus (HMPV), which is being reported in large numbers in China, has been reported in Telangana, Director of Public Health (DPH), Telangana on Saturday said.

In an advisory on Saturday, the DPH, Dr B Ravinder Naik said that there was no cause for alarm regarding HMPV reports from China.

"So far, no case of HMPV has been reported in Telangana. The Health Department has analyzed the data of prevailing respiratory infections in Telangana state. There is no substantial increase of such infections in December 2024 compared to last year December, 2023," the DPH said.

The health department is monitoring the situation closely in collaboration with health officials from union Ministry of Health

### Life sprouts in space: ISRO

ISRO on Saturday said the cowpea seeds it had sent to space onboard the PSLV-C60 POEM-4 platform have germinated under microgravity conditions within four days of the launch of the mission.

The space agency sent eight cowpea seeds as part of the Compact Research Module for Orbital Plant Studies (CROPS) experiment conducted by the

Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre (VSSC) to study plant growth in microgravity conditions. "Life sprouts in space! VSSC's CROPS experiment onboard PSLV-C60 POEM-4 successfully sprouted cowpea seeds in 4 Leaves expected soon," ISRO said on X. The PSLV-C60 mission

placed two SpaDeX satel-

lites in orbit on the night of

December 30. The fourth

stage of the rocket carrying

the POEM-4 platform has

been orbiting the earth with 24 onboard experiments at an altitude of 350 km since Tuesday. The experiment aims to understand how plants grow in the unique conditions of space, which is essential for future longduration space missions.

The experiment involves growing eight cowpea seeds in a controlled environment with active thermal regulation, simulating conditions that plants might encounter during space travel. PTI

### 4 soldiers die as Army truck falls into gorge

Four Army personnel died and another was injured when their vehicle skidded off the road and fell into a gorge due to inclement weather and poor visibility in Jammu and Kashmir's Bandipora district on Saturday, the second tragedy in less than two weeks.

The accident occurred near SK Payen in the north

Kashmir district where the soldiers were on duty, officials said. The region had received snowfall on Thursday and there were foggy

conditions on Saturday.

The Army said "while performing duty in Bandipora, a vehicle of Indian Army skid and fell into the gorge due to inclement weather and poor visibility conditions". J&K L-G Manoj Sinha paid tributes. PTI

## Delhi man cons 700 women on dating apps

Delhi Police arrested a 23year-old man who allegedly scammed over 700 women after befriending them on dating applications by posing as a US-based model, officials said on Saturday.

The cyber police station of West district arrested Tushar Bisht on charges of exploiting online platforms such as Bumble and Snapchat to lure his victims,

blackmail them using private photos and videos, and extort money, a statement issued by Delhi Police said.

"Posing as a US-based freelance model, the accused created fake identities using a virtual international mobile number and photographs of a Brazilian model," Deputy Commissioner of Police (West), Vichitra Veer, said in the Bisht used the fake pro-

files to connect with women aged between 18 and 30 years on various online dating platforms. "His primary targets were users of Bumble, Snapchat and WhatsApp," the statement said.

The DCP said Bisht gained his victims' trust by engaging in conversations, and convinced them to share private and intimate images and videos.

'Once he obtained the content, he resorted to

blackmail, threatening to leak the sensitive material online, or sell them to dark web unless the victims paid him," the DCP said.

Preliminary investigation revealed that the accused interacted with over 500 women on Bumble and 200 others on Snapchat and WhatsApp, police said.

The accused's mobile phone contained incriminating evidence, including objectionable data of victims, a

virtual mobile number, and details of financial transactions involving extortion.

The police also seized 13 credit cards linked to various banks, the statement

The matter came to light on December 13, last year, when a Delhi University student filed a complaint with the cyber police station claiming that she had connected with the accused on Bumble earlier in the year. PTI

#### Scientist Chidambaram passes away

Eminent physicist Rajagopala Chidambaram,

who played a key role in the nuclear tests of 1974 and 1998, passed away on Saturday, according to the Department of Atomic Energy (DAE). He

Chidambaram, who was also associated with the nuclear weapons programme, breathed his last at Jaslok Hospital in Mumbai, a DAE official said. Prime Minister Modi said he was "deeply saddened" by his demise. "He was one of the key architects of India's nuclear programme and made ground-breaking contributions in strengthening India's scientific and strategic capabilities. He will be remembered with gratitude by the whole nation and his efforts will inspire generations to come," the Prime Minister said.
