'Commission culture rampant in Cong govt'

Ex-sarpanches say contractors being charged commission

Cutting across sections, complaints are being made over widespread corruption in the Telangana Congress government.

After politicians, building permission applicants and retired employees, now former sarpanches are also complaining that commission was being demanded from contractors to clear their pending bills.

To this effect, Telangana Sarpanchula Sangam Joint Action Committee lodged a complaint with the Anti-Corruption Bureau stating that officials in the State Finance Commission Commissioner's office were demanding commission from contractors. They appealed that stern action should be taken against officials involved in such irregularities.

Inspector in ACB net

HYDERABAD: The Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) officials caught L Balu Chowhan, Inspector of Shahinayathgunj police station on charges of demanding and accepting bribe on Friday. The bribe amount of Rs 50,000 was seized from him.

Balu Chowhan allegedly initially demanded bribe of Rs 1.5 lakh from the complainant for deleting his name as a suspect in a missing case registered at the Shahinayathgunj PS and not to harass him further.

The complainant had after requests promised to give Rs 50,000 bribe. The ACB officials also raided the police station premises for collecting more details. The arrested person was produced before the special court for ACB cases for remanding in judicial custody.

It may be recalled that BJP MP from Malkajgiri Etala Rajender at a press conference on Sunday had charged that the Finance Department was not clearing even petty bills unless the contractors paid 7-10 per cent commission. At the BJP Executive Committee meeting held here in July, the MP had reportedly charged that employees were not getting their retirement benefits without paying bribes. He had also claimed that builders had to shell out Rs 75 per sft as bribe for obtaining building permissions.

The fact that the State Anti-Corruption Bureau had nabbed over 170 persons in anti-bribery drive across Telangana in 2024 substantiates these charges. Among all government departments, officials from revenue, police, panchayat raj and stamps and registration, were in high numbers nabbed by ACB sleuths. Compared to the six cases registered and nine officials trapped in 2023 by ACB sleuths, the cases increased to 12 and 20 officials trapped

8 killed in blast at ordnance factory

Eight persons were killed after a blast at an ordnance factory in Maharashtra's Bhandara district on Friday morning, union Minister Nitin Gadkari said.

"As per preliminary information, eight persons were killed and seven injured in the blast," Gadkari said. While the Minister put the death toll at eight, District Collector Sanjay Kolte said so far four bodies had been retrieved and five injured persons rescued. Rescue operation was on for four-five persons still trapped under the debris, he said.

The blast took place around 10.30 am at the factory located at Jawahar Nagar, officials said. It led to fire and subsequent building collapse, and a National Disaster Response Force team was deployed immediately for a rescue operation, said an official release. Specialised equipment was

being used for the rescue operation and efforts were on to ensure the safety of all involved, said the release issued by the NDRF.

Defence Minister Rajnath

Singh said he was "deeply saddened" by the incident. All efforts were being made to provide assistance to the affected people, he said on X. "Deeply saddened to know about the blast at Ordnance Factory at Bhandara, Maharashtra," he posted on X (formerly Twitter). PTI

Gram sabhas end on disappointing note

APOLOGISE TO FARMERS FOR **INCOMPLETE CROP LOAN WAIVER: KTR TO REVANTH**

HYDERABAD: BRS working president KT Rama Rao lambasted Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy for making false claims of implementing complete crop loan waiver in Telangana. He demanded that the Chief Minister should apologise to farmers for deceiving them.

He was responding to Health Minister Damodara Raja Narasimha's admission during a meeting that the crop loan waiver was not fully implemented in a village within his constituency.
"Now, who should be ashamed? Who

should resign? Who is lying, and who is telling the truth? It is not us, but your Cabinet colleague who has exposed your lies. Your claims of complete farm loan waiver proved to be a complete farce," Rama Rao said in a post on X. He demanded that Revanth Reddy rub his nose on the ground in Kondareddypalli or Kodangal and apologise to the farmers. He termed the Congress' much-touted Farmers Declaration a hoax and the promise of a complete loan waiver a blatant lie. He called the Congress government a curse on Telangana farmers.

Inter students to explore AI in English language

Artificial Intelligence (AI) curriculum, which so far remained confined to science, engineering and technology, will soon foray into arts, humanities and vocational education as well.

Given the increasing importance of AI in almost every aspect of life, the Telangana Board of Intermediate Education (TG BIE) is contemplating on introducing AI as part of the English language in both first and second-year of Intermediate education.

Initially, it intended to introduce the AI concepts as part of the physics curriculum, replacing some topics from the electronics chapter in the second-year Intermediate. As such, the launch will be only restricted to science students, i.e. MPC and BiPC, but the Board is considering AI learning as part of the English language, which is common for all students. The move is aimed at introducing students to the world of AI, its application to the real world and the ethical aspects involved in

The Board is mulling on introducing machine learning and robotics as well. The idea is to provide students with fair theory and practical knowledge about the niche and emerging technologies, thereby aiding them make informed career

choices for higher education. "The engineering colleges, which introduced AI a couple of years ago, are still struggling to find expertise to teach the subject. The plan is to introduce the basics of AI and its applications and ethical aspects to students in second-year physics. Since such introduction will only be applicable to science students, we are contemplating AI curriculum in English, a common language for all students. We will have clarity by this month-end as the experts committee will meet," a senior official said.

Previously, the Ethics and Human Values paper was integrated into English language from 2023-24
