Gold prices hit record Rs 89k-mark

NEW DELHI: Gold prices soared by Rs 1,300 to hit an all-time high of Rs 89,400 per 10 grams amid heavy buying from iewellers and retailers. according to the All India Sarafa Association. The precious metal of 99.9 per cent purity had closed at Rs 88,100 per 10 grams on Thursday. Gold of 99.5 per cent purity climbed by Rs 1,300 to hit a fresh peak of Rs 89,000 per 10 grams against the previous close of Rs 87,700 per 10 grams. Silver also rallied by Rs 2,000 to hit a four-month high of Rs 1 lakh per kg on Friday. PTI

India-US ties take new flight, IAF to get F-35 jets

US approves extradition of 26/11 terror accused Tahawwur Rana to India

WASHINGTON

India and the United States rekindled their relationship on a high note with a summit between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Donald Trump yield-ing a range of benefits in-cluding the US sale of oil, gas and F-35 fighter aircraft to India, a possible mega trade deal and the immediate extradition of Mumbai attack accused Tahawwur

Trump said after talks with Modi that India will buy more oil, gas and military hardware from America to bring down the trade deficit while asserting that Washington will not spare New Delhi from reciprocal tariffs. At his Oval Office in the White House on Thursday (Friday India time), Trump warmly welcomed Modi with a long handshake and a bear hug and described the Prime Minister as a "great friend" for a long time and a "terrific" man.

"We missed you. We missed you a lot," Trump said as he greeted Modi. The elaborate welcome allayed the trepidation and put to rest the uncertainty that had clouded bilateral relationship after Trump took office last month and unleashed a series of executive orders that have up-

ended the global economic and diplomatic order.

Yet, Modi's visit went off without any hiccups and in fact produced rich dividends. The only fly in the ointment was Trump's announcement a day before the summit that he would impose reciprocal tariffs on countries that do the same with American goods. India is among those countries Trump is targeting, and he did not mince his words when talking about reciprocal tariffs against India during a 44-minute joint news conference with Modi.

Terror reference in talks rattles Pakistan

ISLAMABAD/NEW DELHI: Rattled by specific reference to Pakistan in the India-US Joint Statement issued following the bilateral meeting held between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and US President Donald Trump in Washington, Islamabad on Friday cited its past counter-terrorism cooperation with the United States to express surprise over the

"We consider the Pakistan-specific reference in the Indo-US joint statement of Feb 13 as one-sided, misleading and contrary to diplomatic norms. We are surprised the reference has been added to the joint statement notwithstanding Pakistan's counter-terrorism cooperation with the US,' said Pakistan Foreign Office (FO) spokesperson Shafqat Ali Khan during a weekly media briefing.

Murmu's nod sought to prosecute Jain

NEW DELHI

The union Home Ministry requested the President for a grant of sanction to prosecute AAP leader and former Delhi Minister Satyendar Jain in a money-laundering case being investigated by the ED, sources said.

The sanction against the 60-year-old politician has been sought under Section 218 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, they said. The Ministry requested the sanction from the President of India on the basis of an ED investigation and the presence of 'adequate proof', they added.

The federal agency booked Jain in a money-laundering case linked to alleged hawala dealings and arrested him in May 2022. PTI

US plane with 119 Indian deportees to land today

A US plane carrying 119 illegal immigrants is likely to land at Amritsar airport on February 15, the second such batch of Indians deported by the Trump government as part of a crackdown it resolved to carry out when it was sworn in last month.

According to official sources, the plane is expected to land at the airport around 10 pm on Saturday. Among the 119 illegal In-

dian immigrants, 67 hail from Punjab, 33 from Harvana, eight from Gujarat, three from Uttar Pradesh, two each from Goa, Maharashtra and Rajasthan and one each from Himachal Pradesh and Jammu and Kashmir, they

Hate speech on X up after Musk's takeover

NEW DELHI

Hate speech on the social media platform X spiked by almost 50 per cent in the months following Elon Musk's purchase, compared to the months prior, a new analysis has shown.

Researchers also found that the number of bot and bot-like accounts did not decline during the period Musk was CEO, until June

Previous studies have shown that hate speech increased on X right after the US-based entrepreneur purchased the social media platform — then known as Twitter — and became its CEO, with no reduction in bot-driven activity. PTI

All eyes are now on the BJP central leadership over its next step in strife-torn Manipur, a day after President's rule was imposed in the northeastern State and the Assembly put under suspended animation. Security has been beefed up across the State following the Centre's announcement of President's rule, officials said.

President's rule was imposed in Manipur and the Assembly put under suspended animation on Thursday evening, days after Chief Minister N Biren Singh resigned from his post that led to political uncertainty in the State. The decision came as the BJP failed to build a consensus on a Chief Ministerial candidate, despite having several rounds of discussions between its northeast incharge Sambit Patra and

During the tenure of former Chief Minister K Chandrashekhar Rao, Telangana experienced the highest groundwater rise in the country, transforming even dry lands into rich groundwater zones. Under the current Congress rule, the situation has taken a different turn, with paddy fields drying up and farmers and the general public facing water shortages.

The situation worsened further by the drying up of a 120-km stretch of the Godavari River, which was once brimming with water due to the construction of three barrages - Medi-Annaram, and

Dead chickens were found dumped in the Akkampally balancing reservoir in Pedda Adiserlapally mandal of Nalgonda district on Friday sparking widespread concern. In the backdrop of outbreak of bird flu, which has taken a toll on the poultry industry in the neigh-

bouring districts of Andhra Pradesh, an alert has been sounded in the district. The HMWSSB authorities were also informed about the incident. Meanwhile, the police arrested a poultry farmer, Ramavath Rayamallu, after finding him responsible for dumping the bird flu-infested dead chickens in the reservoir.
