Iran ups uranium production

VIENNA: Iran has accelerated its production of near weapons-grade uranium as tensions between Tehran and Washington rise after the election of US President Donald Trump, a report by the United Nations' nuclear watchdog showed. The report by the Vienna-based International Atomic Energy Agency said as of Febru ary 8, Iran has 274.8 kg of uranium enriched up to 60 per cent. That's an increase of 92.5 kg since the IAEA's last report in November. WORLD PAGE 9

to temples Rat miners reach key point of tunnel; no trace of workers

Passage blocked by debris & water, filled with odour, indicates adverse outcome

The rescue operation at the Srisailam Left Bank Canal (SLBC) tunnel has reached the critical end point of the tunnel, but there is no trace of the missing workers.

Expert rathole miners bravely ventured into the tunnel to save the eight trapped workers. They could access the zero point of the tunnel end but could find none of the eight missing workers and engineers. The entire stretch, whose passage is blocked by debris and water-logging, is filled with a foul smell, indicating an adverse and undesired outcome that is in the offing.

Experts involved in the rescue operation suspect that the workers might be trapped beneath the damaged tunnel boring machine (TBM). The rat miners, who succeeded where all other big names with expertise in such rescue missions failed, are barely 25 years old. The 14-member team of rat miners from Uttarakhand, led by Firoz Qureshi, displayed

Early Wednesday morning, they entered the SLBC tunnel, equipped with only ropes tied to their backs. Clad in simple t-shirts and pants, the team navigated through the critical environment and reached the site of the collapsed 1600- ton TBM

The rat miners cleared the debris, creating a pathway for other rescue teams to follow. Using only small and simple tools, they removed the accumulated mud and water, pushing aside obstacles. reached the last point of the

tunnel and confirmed that the TBM was completely destroyed. They also identified the source of water flow from the tunnel lining and removed the TBM fragments, making the rescue operation more manageable.

KTR blasts Revanth for SLBC tunnel tragedy

BRS working president KT Rama Rao called out Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy for turning a blind eye to the plight of the workers trapped in the SLBC tunnel and also those who were working at the site without salaries for the last three months. He ridiculed the Chief Minister's election campaign and Delhi visit ignoring rescue measures.

"Even after going to Delhi 36 times, he did not bring three rupees for the State," he said. He took to X, criticising Revanth Reddy for his frequent visits to Delhi. He said even as the workers lay trapped and the others struggle without pay for three months, the CM showed little concern. (SEE PAGE 2)

SUN SETS ON 2025 MAHA KUMBH

Reuven Azar, the Ambassador of Israel to India, on Wednesday expressed concerns over reports of leaders of Palestinian terror outfit Hamas going into a huddle with terrorists of Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) and Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) in Pakistan-Occupied

Kashmir (PoK), earlier this month. "Unfortunately, terrorist organisations work in networks and many times they find ways to support each other in a way that is detrimental for many countries, not just for our re-

gion," Azar said. "The fact that, for example, there was a meeting only a couple of weeks

ago in the areas that are under Pakistani control in Kashmir of leaders of Hamas tells you something about how these terrorist organisations are inspiring each other... Apparently, they are cooperating in order to achieve their common goal which is to terrorise us and to terrorise

you. So this is something that we have to take into account," he added.

India on Wednesday marked the sixth anniversary of the "punitive" Balakot airstrike carried out by the Indian Air Force that destroyed the JeM camps in PoK where operatives were trained for suicide missions

and deadly terror attacks. airstrike was part of India's campaign against cross-border terrorism after the horrific Pulwama terror attack in 2019 and manifested the country's willingness to take decisive action against terror infrastructure in Pakistan. Several leaders voiced concerns

over Pakistan's involvement with terrorist organisations to fuel unrest in the region after Hamas Commander Khaled al-Qaddoumi and other Pakistani terrorists were spotted during a rally in PoK. VHP spokesperson Vinod Bansal had said ISI was playing an important role in

this "terror alliance". IANS

'Delimitation will be curse for TG'

BRS working president KT Rama Rao raised serious concerns over the impend ing injustice to Southern States in the proposed delimitation of constituencies. He warned that the Cen-

tre's decision to redraw constituencies based on population would turn into a curse for Telangana and other Southern States such as Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka and Kerala. He extended support to the apprehensions raised by Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin on social media regarding this issue, for fair, transparent and equitable approach in the delimitation process.

Questioning the Modi intentions, government's Rama Rao wondered whether the Centre was planning to penalise Southern States for successfully implementing family planning for the nation's welfare. He strongly criticised the move, stating that executing delimitation solely based on population, without considering the efforts of the Southern States in population control, was against the spirit of democracy and federalism.

WON'T OPPOSE HINDI IF YOU DON'T IMPOSE

CHENNAI: The DMK will not

oppose Hindi if it is not "imposed" on Tamil Nadu and forcing the language on Tamils amounts to playing with their self-respect, state Chief Minister and the ruling party's president M K Stalin said on Wednesday. In a letter to partymen on the issue of alleged Hindi imposition, Stalin said self-

respect was Tamils' 'unique nature. "For those asking why DMK still opposes Hindi, my humble response to them as one among you is—because you still impose it on us." (SEE PAGE 2)

Disqualification: **MLA** ridiculed

Gadwal MLA Bandla Krishnamohan Reddy found himself at the centre of social media ridicule after posting Maha Shivaratri greetings featuring photographs of Congress leaders, despite his recent attempts to distance himself from the party fearing disqualifica-

He is one of the 10 BRS MLAs who defected to the ruling Congress. They now appear to be walking a tightrope, caught between their past affiliations and

the current compulsions. Krishnamohan Reddy, who was elected on a BRS ticket but later defected to the ruling Congress, had lodged a police complaint on February 11, against unknown individuals for using his images on Congress flex

boards without his permission. In his complaint, he insisted that he remained a BRS MLA and claimed a conspiracy was underway to mislead the public about his political affiliation.

However, his Shivaratri greetings post on Wednesday contradicted his own stance. The posters prominently featured Sonia Gandhi, Rahul Gandhi, A Revanth Reddy and other Congress leaders, while conspicuously omitting BRS chief K Chandrashekhar Rao, working president KT Rama Rao and other senior BRS leaders, with whom he claims to be

associated. The irony did not go unnoticed, as netizens ridiculed the Gadwal MLA, suggesting him to file a case against himself for misrepresenting affiliation.
