# **Congress government** monumental failure: KTR

### Says Revanth admitting to Rs 71,000-crore shortfall historic humiliation for TG

BRS working president KT Rama Rao on Monday lashed out at the Congress government, calling it a monumental failure after Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy admitted to a staggering Rs 71,000-crore shortfall in the 2024-25 Budget estimates.

Terming this a historic humiliation for Telangana, he blamed the Congress government for admitting to financial mismanagement even before presenting the State budget.

In an informal media interaction at the Assembly on Monday, Rama Rao attributed Telangana's financial decline to Revanth Reddy's faulty policies.

"The Chief Minister himself has confirmed the bitter truth — Telangana is not rising but falling. His decisions have crippled agriculture, industry and investments. If the economy was truly growing, why has revenue plummeted?" he asked, charging the Congress with sabotaging Telangana's progress out of political vendetta.

Stating that the closure of the Kaleshwaram project was driven by hatred for former Chief Minister K Chandrashekhar Rao rather than practical reasons, he said this move had crippled agri-

Also charging the Congress regime with corruption, he said Revanth Reddy was diverting State funds to the Congress high com-mand. "The Chief Minister is busy sending funds to Mallikarjun Kharge, Rahul Gandhi, Priyanka Gandhi and KC Venugopal while Telangana suffers," he said, questioning the silence of both the Congress and BJP on BJP MLA T Raja Singh's allegations of secret meetings between BJP and Congress leaders.

The BRS working president criticised Revanth Reddy's focus on gossip rather than governance. "We don't care about his Delhi visits or meetings with Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Rahul Gandhi. What matters is what Telangana has gained, and the answer is nothing," he stated, also alleging that the Chief Minister was ruining Telangana with his incompetence and realising the allegations of the Andhra rulers during State formation. ## 164 forest fires every day in State this year

In an alarming trend, the State is recording an average of above 164 forest fires every day, with human errors and not mere accidents, said to be triggering the shocking number of wildfires even in critical tiger reserves in Telangana.

According to official data, Telangana registered a staggering 11,434 forest fires from January 1 to March 10 this year. The gravity of the situation is evident when this figure is compared against the 14,027 forest fires that were reported in an entire year in 2024! On an average, the State has witnessed nearly 163.4 forest fires a day in 2025.

While the Bhadradri circle saw 3,243 wildfires in the last 70-odd days, 2,479 forest fires occurred in the Kawal Tiger Reserve.

### China hails Modi's remarks on ties

China on Monday appreciated Prime Minister Narendra Modi's "positive" remarks on the Sino-Indian ties favouring dialogue over discord and said that a cooperative "dance between the elephant and dragon" contributing to mutual success is the only choice for both sides.

"China appreciated Prime Minister Narendra Modi's recent positive statements on China-India relations," Foreign Ministry spokesperson Mao Ning said while responding to a question on Modi's remarks in conversation with American podcaster Lex Fridman. The successful meeting between President Xi Jinping and Modi in Kazan,

Russia, last October provided strategic guidance for the improvement and development of the bilateral ties, she said.

"Both earnestly followed through on the important common understandings of our leadstrengthened exchanges and practical cooperation at all levels, and achieved a series of positive outcomes," she said.


On Modi's remarks that the relationship between India and China isn't something new as both nations have ancient cultures and civilisations and have for centuries learned from each other, Mao said, "In the 2,000-plus history, the mainstream of China-India interactions has been friendly exchanges." ### Kerala officials shoot tiger in self-defence

Forest officials on Monday shot dead a tiger in selfdefence as it attacked them during a tranquilising mission in Vandiperi-yar in this hill district of Kerala.

The injured big cat, which strayed from nearby forests, triggered panic among locals as it killed some domestic animals in Granby estate area in the recent days. Though the wildlife officials fired tranquiliser shots when it was spotted inside a tea estate in the morning, the tiger suddenly charged at them forcing the team to open fire for self defence.

A senior wildlife official later said the second tranquiliser shot was successfully fired but the animal suddenly turned aggresive and destroyed the helmet of a wildlife staff by hitting at it. PTI

## 'Amitabh Bachchan was dragged into Bofors scam'

NEW DELHI

Bollywood megastar Amitabh Bachchan was sought to be implicated in the Bofors scandal by a planted story linking his name to a secret Swiss account for kickbacks from the Swedish arms giant as part of a "vicious campaign", says journalist Chitra Subramaniam

"No, there was absolutely no shred of evidence that he (Amitabh Bachchan) had taken any money. But the water had been muddied so much that by the time the water could be cleaned up, the damage had been done," Subramaniam said. "And you know how it is like,



imagine the name of the Bachchans, I mean it's a big name..." Subramaniam, who has detailed how she faced pressure to find any proof of the involvement of the Bachchans — the Big B and his brother Ajitabh — after their names cropped up in the scandal, in her recently released 'Boforsgate:

Journalist's Pursuit of Truth', accused a section of the then government and media of trying to implicate the Bollywood megastar, who was then a member of Lok Sabha from Allahabad.

"And you say the sixth account...there was no sixth account. It didn't exist... it was planted by the Indian government officials," she said, and called out the media and some then officials from top legal authorities of a "habit of speaking around loosely".

"You don't speak loosely as a journalist... if you are a journalist or an official of stature, you don't speak loosely, throwing names here and there," she said. IANS

### Chandrayaan-5 mission approved

NEW DELHI

The Centre has approved the Chandrayaan-5 mission, and it will carry a whopping 250-kg rover to the lunar surface, said Indian Space Research Organisation Chairman V Narayanan.

It will be the fifth flight as part of the Chandrayaan programme, also known as the Indian Lunar Exploration Programme, and aims for the exploration of the Moon. While Chandrayaan-3 carried a 25-kg rover named 'Prayagyaan,' the Chandrayaan-5 mission,

in collaboration with Japan, will feature a much heavier 250-kg rover.

### TN spaceport to see first SSLV launch in 2027

The Kulasekarapattinam spaceport in Tamil Nadu's Thoothukudi district, the second launch complex for ISRO outside Andhra Pradesh, will see the maiden launch with the Small Satellite Launch Vehicle in 24 months. The SSLV will support polar launches of upto 500 kg, with Indian industry involved in production. AGENCIES

## 3 from TG die in US accident

In a tragic incident, a family of three from Shadnagar died in a road accident in the US. As per available information, Pragathi Reddy (35), her son Harveen (6) and mother-in-law Sunitha (56) died in the accident.

Pragathi Reddy was the daughter of former Sarpanch Mohan Reddy of Tekulapalli village in Kondurgu mandal of Shadnagar. According to information reaching here, the family was travelling in a car on March 16 and another car, which was hurtling down on the wrong route, collided

with it leading to three deaths around 3 am (IST). It is said that Pragathi returned to the US just three months ago. She was married to Rohit Reddy from Bakricheprial village of Sid-

dipet district and lived in Florida. The news of the accident has cast a shadow of sadness over Tekulapalli village. Other family members are on their way to the US for the final rites.
